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Ms. Patterson reported on the Sound Transit Executive Committee meeting. The committee heard the results of a public opinion survey. That survey indicated that economic concerns in the region have surpassed the public's concerns about traffic and transportation. She indicated that the economy and unemployment are overshadowing transportation concerns and people prefer that Sound Transit control its costs rather than meeting requests of local governments. The committee also had an update on the communication plan and state and federal legislative agenda.

Other Business

Mr. von Reichbauer informed the members that Joni Earl, Executive Director, Sound Transit, who is currently in the hospital, will be taking a two month medical leave of absence.
