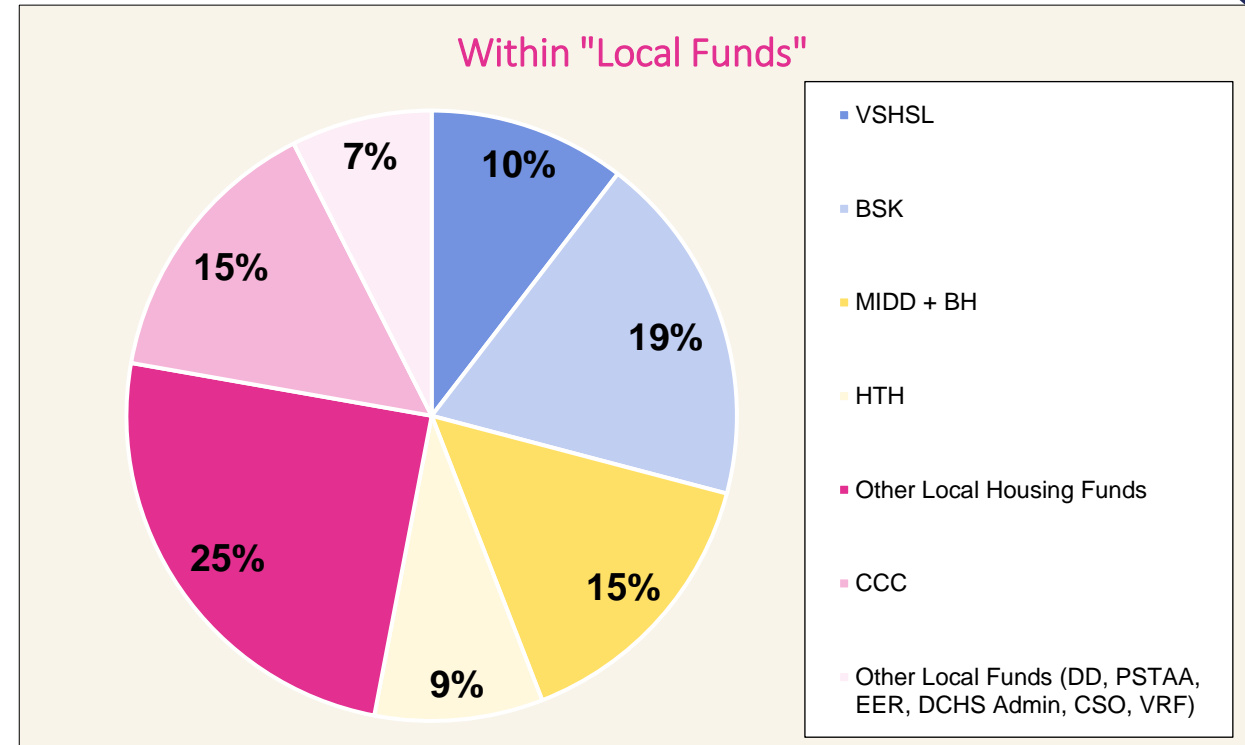
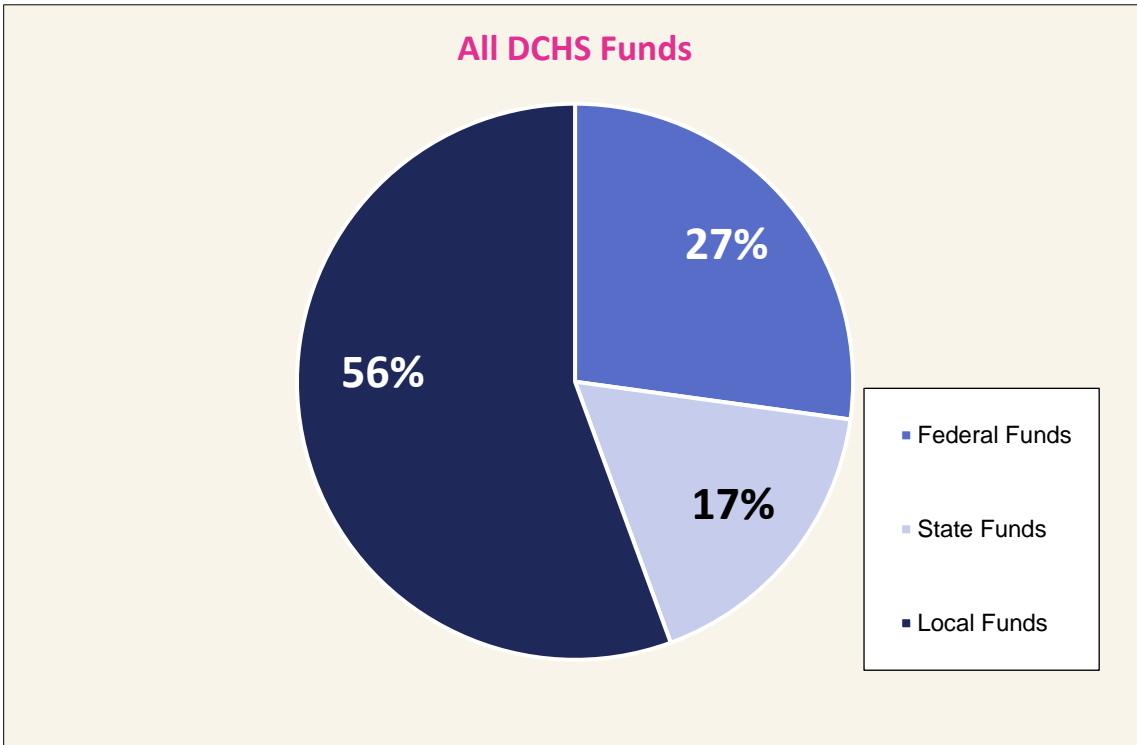

# DCHS General Fund Overview for 2026-27 Budget

- **DCHS has 13 operating funds across 5 divisions**
  - The Adult Services Division and the Children, Youth, and Young Adults Division manage most General Funds through 2 operating funds
  - 3 of 5 DCHS divisions now generally receive no ongoing General Fund revenues (Behavioral Health and Recovery, Developmental Disabilities and Early Childhood Supports, and Housing and Community Development)
- **DCHS is planning for elimination of 100% of General Fund revenues**
  - \$25 million
  - 13 programs
  - ~15 positions

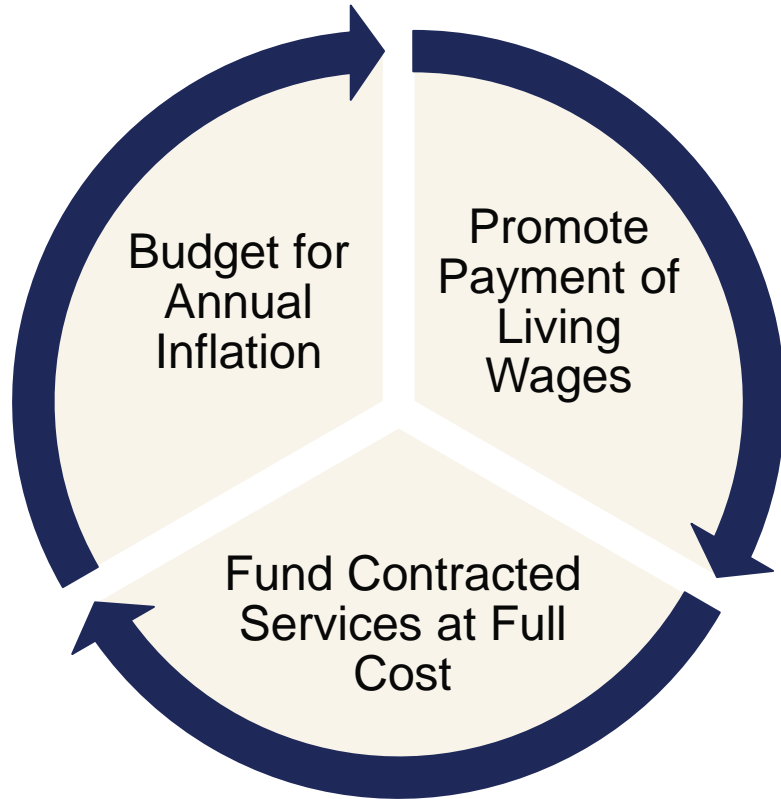
# Youth, Young Adult, and Adult Services At Risk

- **Employment, Education Resources Fund (EER) - \$8M**
  - Restorative Community Pathways - \$4.8M
  - Youth and Family Services Association - \$1.4M
  - Youth education and employment re-engagement - \$1.4M
  - Transportation services for justice involved youth - \$200K
  - Implementation and leadership staff - \$200K
- **Community Services Operating Fund (CSO) - \$4.2M**
  - Services for survivors of domestic violence and sexual assault - \$2.4M
  - Legal services - \$520K
  - Senior services - \$180K
  - Legacy of Equality, Leadership, and Organizing (LELO) - \$120K
  - ASD admin - \$980K
