Dear Councilmember Perry:

This letter transmits a proposed Ordinance that would, if enacted, adopt amendments to the 2021 King County Countywide Planning Policies (CPPs). The enclosed proposed amendments were recommended by the King County Growth Management Planning Council (GMPC) on November 19, 2025.

As a part of the shared framework for growth management planning established by the CPPs, housing and employment growth targets are adopted for each jurisdiction. Jurisdictions use these targets as growth assumptions to plan for development capacity and public services in their comprehensive plans. King County uniquely has multiple growth targets for distinct Potential Annexation Areas within the urban unincorporated area.

In July 2025, the Puget Sound Regional Council (PSRC) certified King County's Comprehensive Plan. In its certification report, PSRC encouraged King County to work "promptly" with GMPC to amend growth targets for the Black Diamond Potential Annexation Area which had a 128-unit capacity deficit to accommodate its growth target. GMPC began its discussions in September 2025.

Urban unincorporated King County has abundant capacity for its growth targets overall. The GMPC proposed this as a solution to the capacity gap, reapportioning 128 units from the Black Diamond Potential Annexation Area to the Unaffiliated Urban Unincorporated area. Unaffiliated Urban Unincorporated has the greatest share of capacity within the urban unincorporated area, with most of its capacity located in southern King County.

At its November 2025 meeting, the GMPC unanimously approved GMPC Motion 25-3 recommending the growth target amendments for urban unincorporated King County.
