STRIKING AMENDMENT TO PROPOSED ORDINANCE 2011-0399, VERSION

- 3 On page 1, beginning on line 8, strike everything through page 11, line 70, and insert:
- 4 "STATEMENT OF FACTS:
- 5 1. The King County healthcare coalition is a network of healthcare
- 6 organizations committed to emergency preparedness and response. It has
- 7 more than three hundred participating organizations which prepare for
- 8 emergencies through collaborative planning, training and exercises. The
- 9 department of public health administers the healthcare coalition.
- 10 2. The healthcare coalition was originally funded with seed money
- 11 through a one-time appropriation in 2005 related to medical surge
- 12 preparedness for pandemic flu planning. Since then, the healthcare
- 13 coalition has been funded solely with federal preparedness grant funds.
- 14 which are steadily declining.
- 15 3. Healthcare organizations that participate in the healthcare coalition and
- 16 the department of public health have developed options for sustaining
