

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT
BY AND BETWEEN
KING COUNTY
AND
INTERNATIONAL FEDERATION OF PROFESSIONAL AND TECHNICAL
EMPLOYEES, LOCAL 17
REPRESENTING
INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY EMPLOYEES

SUBJECT: 2007 Cost of Living Adjustment

Background:

1. King County and the International Federation of Professional and Technical Engineers, Local 17 (the Union) are parties to a collective bargaining agreement that establishes the terms and conditions of employment for the information technology employees in the King County Office of Information Resource Management and the Departments of Adult and Juvenile Detention; Community and Human Services; Development and Environmental Services; Executive Services; Judicial Administration; and Natural Resources and Parks. The collective bargaining agreement expired on December 31, 2006.

2. Article 9, Section 2 of the collective bargaining agreement provides that effective on January 1 of each year of the agreement, the base wage rates in effect on the previous December 31st will be increased by 90% CPI-W All Cities Index (September to September) with a maximum increase of six percent but no less than two percent.

3. The parties are actively engaged in collective bargaining to establish the terms of a successor collective bargaining agreement.

4. This Memorandum of Agreement is being executed to provide for timely cost of living adjustments in 2007 during the course of collective bargaining.

Agreement:

1. King County and the Union hereby agree that wages for all members of the bargaining unit in effect on December 31, 2006 shall be increased by 90% CPI-W All Cities, based on September-to-September figures of the preceding year. Such percentage increase will not be less than two percent, nor will it be greater than six percent. This amount is known to be 2.0%.

2. This Agreement will become effective upon full and final approval by the King County Council.
