1 **AMENDMENT TO STRIKING AMENDMENT S1 TO PROPOSED ORDINANCE**

2 **2021-0238, VERSION 1**

3 On page 21, after line 462 insert:

4 "SECTION 3. Ordinance 19210, Section 20, as amended, is hereby amended as
5 follows:

6 SHERIFF - From the general fund there is hereby appropriated to:

7 Sheriff \$248,000

8 The maximum number of additional FTEs for sheriff shall be: 1.0

9 ER1 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

10 Of this appropriation, \$397,933 shall be expended or encumbered solely to keep
11 the Fourth Avenue entrance to the King County Courthouse open and accessible during
12 normal operating hours. Moneys restricted by this expenditure restriction shall not be
13 expended or encumbered until King County has entered Stage 4 of the Governor of
14 Washington state's Safe Start Plan included in the Governor's "Safe Start - Stay Healthy"
15 County-By-County Phased Reopening emergency proclamations issued in response to the
16 coronavirus 2019 disease and the King County Courthouse has returned to normal
17 operations.

18 ER2 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

19 Of this appropriation, moneys shall not be expended or encumbered for the
20 following:

21 A. To obtain, retain, possess, access or use: (1) any facial recognition service; or
22 (2) facial recognition information;

23 B. To enter into a contract or agreement with any third party for the purpose of
24 obtaining, retaining, possessing, accessing or using, by or on behalf of the sheriff's office,
25 any facial recognition service or facial recognition information; or

26 C. To issue any permit or license or enter into a contract or other agreement that
27 authorizes any third party, on behalf of the sheriff's office, to obtain, retain, possess,
28 access or use: (1) any facial recognition service; or (2) facial recognition information.

29 ER3 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

30 Of this appropriation, \$20,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely for the
31 development of a community-led, crime watch pilot program for unincorporated King
32 County. The program should include processes for unincorporated King County
33 residents to acquire crime watch signs and establish block watch captains who would
34 serve as the primary point of contact between the sheriff's office and the neighborhood.

35 ER4 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

36 Of this appropriation, \$25,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to provide
37 the city of Maple Valley with moneys for coordination of traffic control with other
38 jurisdictions in the unincorporated areas around Lake Wilderness park for the national
39 IRONMAN triathlon scheduled to take place on September 19, 2021.

40 ER5 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

41 Of this appropriation, \$630,000 of general fund revenues shall be expended or

42 encumbered solely for personnel costs related to the Juneteenth holiday for all county
43 employees in 2022. The moneys encumbered in this expenditure restriction shall only be
44 expended upon the enactment of Ordinance 19209.

45 ER6 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

46 Of this appropriation, \$400,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to
47 support a mental and behavioral health navigator program in unincorporated King County
48 for mental and behavioral health professionals to assist sheriff deputies encountering at-
49 risk individuals to connect the individuals to mental and behavioral health services and
50 treatments as an alternative to incarceration or hospitalization.

51 ER7 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

52 Of this appropriation, \$1,050,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to
53 support sheriff deputies performing emphasis patrols around the perimeter of the King
54 County Courthouse to the end of the biennium in furtherance of the 2017
55 recommendations from the courthouse security work group.

56 ER8 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

57 Of this appropriation, \$200,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to
58 support a wellness and resiliency pilot project in the sheriff's office. To improve on-the-
59 job performance and reduce the use-of-force instances and community complaints, the
60 wellness and resiliency program shall facilitate and provide for department of public
61 safety employees access to health and wellness resources, such as programs to combat
62 dependency on alcohol or drugs and mental and physical health improvement programs,
63 as well as to provide voluntary debriefs among and with deputies and detectives engaged
64 in high-stress work such as a rotation in the child pornography investigation unit. The

65 program may not administer county benefits but, rather, will address the unique stressors
66 in law enforcement and connect department of public safety employees to resources.

67 ER9 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

68 Of this appropriation, \$248,000 of general fund revenues shall be expended or
69 encumbered solely for one FTE position for a recruiter to support recruitment of new
70 deputies.

71 P1 PROVIDED THAT:

72 Of this appropriation, no moneys shall be expended or encumbered to fill the one
73 school resource officer position requested by the Renton School District until:

74 A. At least one-half of all high school students in the schools to be served by the
75 school resource officer are receiving onsite in-person classroom instruction at least two
76 days per week; and

77 B. The sheriff has certified that the requesting jurisdiction still desires to contract
78 for the position. The sheriff shall transmit the certification electronically to the clerk of
79 the council, who shall retain an electronic copy and provide an electronic copy to all
80 councilmembers.

81 P2 PROVIDED FURTHER THAT:

82 Of this appropriation, \$150,000 shall not be expended or encumbered until the
83 sheriff transmits a report describing its body-worn camera and in-car camera systems
84 pilot program and a motion that should acknowledge receipt of the report and a motion
85 acknowledging the report is passed by the council. The motion should reference the
86 subject matter, the proviso's ordinance number, ordinance section and proviso number in
87 both the title and body of the motion.

88 The report shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

89 A. A description of the proposed policies and procedures for the use of body-
90 worn camera and in-car camera systems by sheriff's office personnel;

91 B. A description of the work performed by the King County department of
92 information technology program manager to evaluate and assess body-worn camera and
93 in-car camera systems on behalf of the sheriff's office for the pilot project. The
94 description shall include the list of all vendors reviewed by the program manager and an
95 explanation for why the awarded vendor was selected for the pilot program;

96 C. The frequency and location of patrols by sheriff's office personnel equipped
97 with body-worn cameras and in-car cameras;

98 D. A description of the sheriff's office's community engagement efforts,
99 particularly as they relate to efforts to engage with Black, Indigenous and people of color
100 communities, regarding the use of body-worn camera and in-car camera systems by
101 sheriff's office personnel in the geographic areas selected for the pilot program and across
102 the county as a whole. The description shall include a summary of the comments and
103 general feedback provided by communities regarding the use of body-worn camera and
104 in-car camera systems by sheriff's office personnel; and

105 E. A description of the pilot program's outcomes and lessons learned.

106 The sheriff should electronically file the report and motion required by this
107 proviso no later than October 31, 2021, with the clerk of the council, who shall retain an
108 electronic copy and provide an electronic copy to all councilmembers, the council chief
109 of staff and the lead staff for the law and justice, or its successor.

110 P3 PROVIDED FURTHER THAT:

111 Of this appropriation, \$10,000 shall not be expended or encumbered until the
112 sheriff's office transmits a health and wellness program report and a motion that should
113 acknowledge receipt of the report is passed by the council. The motion should reference
114 the subject matter, the proviso's ordinance number, ordinance section, and proviso
115 number in both the title and body of the motion.

116 The report shall include, but not be limited to:

117 A. A description of the health and wellness programs facilitated by the wellness
118 and resiliency program and offered to department of public safety personnel, including
119 those programs intended to assist in coping with stress, combatting substance dependency
120 of alcohol and drugs and improvements to mental and physical health;

121 B. An assessment of the program's contribution to increasing individuals'
122 willingness to seek help;

123 C. An assessment of the participation rates of sworn sheriff officers and civilian
124 employees in the department of public safety in each health and wellness program
125 facilitated by the wellness and resiliency program; and

126 D. An evaluation of the effectiveness of the health and wellness programs
127 facilitated by the wellness and resiliency program.

128 The sheriff's office should electronically file the report and motion required by
129 this proviso no later than September 30, 2022, with the clerk of the council, who shall
130 retain an electronic copy and provide an electronic copy to all councilmembers, the
131 council chief of staff and the lead staff for the law and justice committee, or its
132 successor."

133 Renumber the remaining sections consecutively and correct any internal references
134 accordingly.
