Dear Chair Forsman:

The King County Code requires the King County Department of Transportation (DOT) to notify you of any departmental action that may affect your treaty fishing rights, including development of wetlands, stream and river banks, or lakeshore habitat of water bodies, or development directly or indirectly affecting anadromous bearing water bodies. Such actions encompass the adoption of ordinances.

To satisfy this requirement, DOT is hereby notifying you that the King County Executive is proposing an ordinance that would adopt revisions to the Transportation Concurrency Management Program. These revisions include an updated Transportation Concurrency Travel Shed Boundaries map and code text changes to reflect updated submittal requirements for the update report. There will not be changes to the annual Transportation Concurrency map update process, as I had previously identified in a letter dated August 26, 2011.

The King County Executive will transmit this ordinance to the King County Council in September 2011. The King County Council will review and consider the proposed ordinance as part of the public legislative process. The concurrency ordinance and adoption process can be tracked on the following website: <http://www.kingcounty.gov/kcdot/roads/planning/concurrency/index.cfm>.

By sending this notice, DOT is in no way making any claims as to whether the above-described ordinance will have any effect on your tribe's fishing rights. In satisfying the notice requirement, DOT has chosen to be over-inclusive rather than under-inclusive in selecting proposed ordinances to report.
