

DETERMINATION OF NON-SIGNIFICANCE

Title of Proposal: Ames Lake Water Association Water System Plan, March 2018

Description of Proposal: The plan discussed the existing and probable future water supply sources and demands in the Ames Lake Water Association service area over the next 20 years. The plan includes population projections, water demand projections, a water conservation program, a six-year capital improvement program, operations and maintenance standards, and financial policies.


Location of Proposal: The Ames Lake Water Association is located in unincorporated King County approximately 1-1/2 miles north of the community of Fall City, and west across the Snoqualmie River from the City of Carnation. The Association has a total of 1,145 active connections, serving a population of approximately 3,206.
