# Ordinance 19979

	Proposed No. 2025-0267.3 Sponsors Mosqueda
1	AN ORDINANCE relating to prohibiting algorithmic rent
2	fixing; and adding a new chapter to K.C.C. Title 12.
3	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:
4	SECTION 1. Sections 2 through 6 of this ordinance should constitute a new
5	chapter in K.C.C. Title 12.
6	NEW SECTION. SECTION 2. The definitions in this section apply throughout
7	this chapter unless the context clearly requires otherwise.
8	A. "Coordinating services" means a service provider:
9	1. Collecting historical, anticipated, or contemporary prices, price changes,
10	supply levels, occupancy rates, or lease or rental contract termination and renewal dates
11	of residential dwelling units from two or more landlords, from private databases, or from
12	public databases; and
13	2. Analyzing or processing the information described in subsection A.1. of this
14	section through the use of a system or software that utilizes an algorithmic or other
15	automated process to provide recommendations regarding rental prices, lease renewal
16	terms, or occupancy levels to more than one landlord. "Coordinating services" does not
17	include publishing rental price estimates that are solely based on publicly available
18	information; are equally available to all members of the public; and do not require a
19	contract or agreement to obtain.
20	B. "Dwelling unit" has the same meaning as "dwelling unit" in K.C.C. 12.25.010.

21	C. "Landlord" has the same meaning as "landlord" in K.C.C. 12.25.010.
22	D. "Person" means an individual, firm, corporation, association, governmental
23	entity, or partnership and its agents or assigns.
24	E. "Service provider" means a person that performs a coordinating service.
25	NEW SECTION. SECTION 3.
26	A. It is a violation of this chapter for two or more landlords to enter into an
27	agreement, including but not limited to written, verbal, or inferred from conduct, to
28	establish rental prices, consistent with federal law.
29	B. It is a violation of this chapter for a landlord, in or affecting commerce, to
30	contract with or otherwise exchange anything of value in return for the coordinating
31	services of a service provider.
32	C. It is a violation of this chapter for a service provider, in or affecting
33	commerce, to provide coordinating services to two or more landlords.
34	D. It is not a violation of this chapter for a landlord to:
35	1. Use a system or software recordkeeping tool absent otherwise prohibited
36	conduct under this chapter;
37	2. Generate or use a report, study, or presentation that provides existing rental
38	data in an aggregated manner but does not recommend rent prices, fees, or occupancy
39	rates or other rental contract terms for future leases; or
40	3. Provide or use information for the purpose of conducting market research for
41	project financing or for conducting an appraisal.
42	NEW SECTION. SECTION 4. A person injured by a violation of this chapter
43	may bring a civil action in a court of competent jurisdiction against a landlord or other

service provider violating this chapter to recover damages up to seven thousand five			
hundred dollars per violation in addition to any actual damages incurred. Each instance			
of coordinating services for each dwelling unit may be considered a separate violation.			
The court may award reasonable attorneys' fees and costs to any person injured by a			
violation of this chapter if that person is the prevailing party.			
NEW SECTION. SECTION 5. This chapter does not apply to short-term rentals.			
NEW SECTION. SECTION 6. County websites and communications materials			
that educate the public about tenant protections for unincorporated King County shall			
include information about the requirements of this chapter. Communications materials			
should also include resources that may be able to provide legal assistance to residents.			
SECTION 7.			
A. The executive shall prepare a rent-fixing enforcement study report.			
B. The report shall include, but not be limited to:			
1. An evaluation of options for enforcing the requirements of this ordinance,			
including a discussion of potential county agencies that could be tasked with fielding and			
investigating complaints and making referrals to the prosecuting attorney's office;			
2. The estimated cost of each option evaluated, and potential funding sources			
for each option;			
3. A recommended approach for enforcing the new chapter created by this			
ordinance;			
4. An assessment of possible strategies for educating landlords about the			
requirements of this ordinance, including the identification of existing points of contact			
with landlords such as during permitting processes; and			

67	5. A discussion of whether property management companies have an unfair
68	advantage when setting rental prices and whether there are additional actions the county
69	could consider to protect renters against rent-fixing.
70	C. The executive shall electronically file the report no later than July 15, 2026,
71	with the clerk of the council, who shall retain an electronic copy and provide an
72	electronic copy to all councilmembers, the council chief of staff, and the lead staff for the
73	health, housing, and human services committee, or its successor. If legislative action is
74	necessary to implement the recommendations of the report, a proposed ordinance shall be
75	transmitted with the report.
76	SECTION 8. Severability. If any provision of this ordinance or its application to
