1 **AMENDMENT TO STRIKING AMENDMENT S1 TO PROPOSED ORDINANCE**

2 **2022-0220, VERSION 2**

3 On page 35, strike everything beginning on line 773 through line 775, and insert

4 "MENTAL ILLNESS AND DRUG DEPENDENCY FUND - From the mental  
5 illness and drug dependency fund there is hereby disappropriated from:

6 Mental illness and drug dependency fund (\$5,000,000)

7 SECTION 33. The council directs that section 32 of this ordinance takes effect  
8 before section 34 of this ordinance.

9 SECTION 34. Ordinance 19210, Section 69, as amended, is hereby amended as  
10 follows:

11 MENTAL ILLNESS AND DRUG DEPENDENCY FUND - From the mental  
12 illness and drug dependency fund there is hereby appropriated to:

13 Mental illness and drug dependency fund \$11,000,000

14 ER1 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

15 Of this appropriation, \$500,000 of mental illness drug dependency levy revenue  
16 shall be expended or encumbered solely to support the Recovery Café.

17 ER2 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

18           Of this appropriation, \$2,000,000 of mental illness drug dependency levy revenue  
19 shall be expended or encumbered solely to support behavioral health providers to provide  
20 behavioral health services for youth, with prioritization of school-based services, mental  
21 health first aid for youth and suicide prevention for youth. The behavioral health  
22 providers who receive funding restricted in this Expenditure Restriction ER2 shall be  
23 providers who are contracted with King County to provide services identified as priorities  
24 in this Expenditure Restriction ER2 or selected following a competitive process  
25 determined collaboratively between the behavioral health and recovery division and the  
26 mental illness and drug dependency advisory committee.

27           ER3 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:

28           Of this appropriation, \$3,000,000 of mental illness drug dependency levy revenue  
29 shall be expended or encumbered solely to support behavioral health providers, with  
30 prioritization of children and youth behavioral health services providers, that provide  
31 services funded by the mental illness drug dependency levy by adjusting the amounts of  
32 their existing contracts to account for increased costs such as the effects of inflation. The  
33 behavioral health providers who receive funding restricted in this Expenditure Restriction  
34 ER3 shall be providers who are contracted with King County. The executive shall  
35 consult with the mental illness and drug dependency advisory committee in implementing  
36 monies restricted under this Expenditure Restriction ER3."

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38           Renumber the remaining sections consecutively and correct any internal references  
39 accordingly.

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41 **EFFECT prepared by S. Porter and A. Kim: *The amendment would reallocate \$5***  
42 ***million of unspent (or underspend) MIDD levy revenue from the 2021-2022 biennium***  
43 ***for the following:***

- 44 ***1. \$2 million to support behavioral health providers that provide behavioral health***  
45 ***services for youth with prioritization of school-based services, mental health***  
46 ***first aid for youth and suicide prevention for youth, and***
- 47 ***2. \$3 million to support behavioral health providers, with prioritization of children***  
48 ***and youth behavioral health services providers, that provide services funded by***  
49 ***the mental illness drug dependency levy by adjusting the amounts of their***  
50 ***existing contracts to account for increased costs such as the effects of inflation.***
