Ms. Lambert reported on her attendance at the National Association of Counties Conference. She indicated that the topics that were covered were emergency preparedness and reducing costs in our jails. She explained the participants were given a number of issues to deal with as though they were really happening and indicated how interesting it was to learn about how different things are approached in different ways. She also indicated that FEMA also met with the group and discussed a number of changes regarding housing and sheltering. Ms. Lambert offered the loan of a CD that was given to each participant for anyone interested.

Mr. Gossett made comments regarding the African American community and the incarceration rate.

Ms. Patterson reported on the Forecast Council and its first official meeting. Tom Goodwin, Chief Economist, introduced members to the staff. Ms. Patterson explained the primary purpose of the Forecast Council is to get a much more accurate idea of what our budget situation will be. Mr. Goodwin briefed members on the economic and tax loss that would be experienced by a major flood in the Green River Valley.

Ms. Patterson reported on the recent Board of Health meeting. The Board welcomed three new members: Councilmember Conlin, city of Seattle, Councilmember Jan Drago and Dr. Ben Danielson, health professional. The Board passed regulations regarding animal to human disease prevention.

The Board also received a legislative update and report on the H1N1vaccination and outreach and a report on new labeling.
