TITLE AMENDMENT TO PROPOSED ORDINANCE 2019-0084, VERSION 1

On page 1, beginning on line 1, strike lines 1 through 20, and insert:

"AN ORDINANCE providing for the submission to the qualified electors of King County at a special election to be held in King County on August 6, 2019, of a proposition authorizing a property tax levy in excess of the levy limitation contained in chapter 84.55 RCW for a period of six consecutive years, at a total rate of not more than \$0.1832 per one thousand dollars of assessed valuation in the first year and limiting annual levy increases by the King County inflation plus population index published by the King County office of economic and financial analysis, or the chapter 84.55 RCW limitation, whichever is greater in years two through six for the purpose of maintaining and operating King County's open space system; improving parks, recreation, access and mobility in the King County open space system by acquiring lands and continuing to

18 develop regional trails; improving parks and trails in and
19 acquiring lands by metropolitan parks districts, towns and
20 cities in King County; funding environmental education,
21 maintenance and conservation programs at the Woodland
22 Park Zoo; funding capital construction at the Seattle
23 Aquarium; and funding for capital improvements at
24 publicly owned pools, for all King County residents."
