- 4 "\$3 million dollars in general fund underspend towards increased rental assistance
- 5 funding for United Way of King County. The council recognizes that the Seattle and
- 6 King County region received approximately \$67 million in federal Department of
- 7 Housing and Urban Development Continuum of Care funds from the Department of
- 8 Housing and Urban Development's competitive 2024 Continuum of Care Notice of
- 9 Funding Opportunity. That funding supports housing and essential services for more
- than 4,400 Seattle and King County residents who are or were previously homeless. The
- 2025 Continuum of Care Notice of Funding Opportunity limits the amount of funding for
- 12 permanent housing to thirty percent, resulting in the likely loss or reduction of
- 13 Continuum of Care funding to Seattle and King County for the fiscal biennium, putting
- 14 housing and services for thousands of people in King County at risk. Between Seattle,
- 15 King County, and the King County Regional Homelessness Authority, a contingency
- fund of at least \$36 million has been identified as needed to sustain homes and supportive
- services that are immediately at risk. Additional funding might be necessary if
- 18 Department of Housing and Urban Development makes more drastic reductions or

19	limitations on Continuum of Care funding. Following review of the impact that the 2025
20	Continuum of Care Notice of Funding Opportunity release has on the Seattle and King
21	County region, the council requests the executive to transmit a supplemental

23	paired with funding in partnership from the City of Seattle, for a regional Continuum of
24	Care contingency plan by March 16, 2026. The Continuum of Care contingency moneys
25	should look at any available additional revenue, available reserves, and any available
26	general fund underspend from the 2025 Annual Budget."

28	EFFECT prepared by O.Brey: The amendment would reduce the Finding related to
29	the prior year underspend to \$3 million for rental assistance and request the Executive
30	to transmit a supplemental budget by March 16, 2026, that considers reserves,
31	additional revenue, and underspend from the 2025 budget to address cuts to the federal
32	Continuum of Care program.
