**Proposed Substitute Ordinance 2016-0392**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that a public hearing will be held before the Metropolitan King County Council, Room 1001, King County Courthouse, Seattle, Washington on the 27th day of February, 2017, at 1:30 p.m., to consider adoption of Proposed Substitute Ordinance No. 2016-0392 relating to transportation concurrency, adopting a new transportation concurrency test results map, adopting a new map indicating the boundaries of the concurrency travel sheds, and amending King County Code.

**SUMMARY:**

The transportation concurrency test results map identifies which travel sheds throughout unincorporated King County pass or fail the concurrency test, as measured by travel time standards applied to principal and minor arterials. A proposed development must be in a passing travel shed as an initial step in the project development process, or must qualify for level of service F. The new concurrency test results map was generated using travel time data collected in spring 2016 and applied to travel speed level of standards established in the King County Comprehensive Plan. The new maps replace the current maps adopted in January 2013.

Proposed Substitute Ordinance 2016-0392 amends K.C.C. 14.70. Among the changes are: added language directing that the concurrency system address the urban and rural nature of the county, the deletion of language that applies the concurrency test to certain State Highways of State-wide Significance and addresses monitoring of collector arterials; and elimination of the concurrency expert review panel.

The maps and code changes will be reviewed and potentially approved by the King County Council.
