

### Chronological Summary of the BDOL Program

<b>July 2008</b>	Motion 12820 passed, approving a plan for Accessible Voting Centers and Ballot Drop Boxes
<b>August 2008</b>	KCE implements Phase 1 of Ballot Drop Box plan (10 boxes)
<b>August- November 2009</b>	KCE Implements Phase 2 of Ballot Drop Box plan (19 boxes)
<b>November 2009</b>	Budget shortfall, Ballot Drop boxes reduced to (2) locations
<b>Summer 2010</b>	In response to voter input, KC Executive and Council recommend redeployment of Ballot Drop Boxes
<b>November 2010</b>	KCE re-deploys 11 boxes, using the Puget Sound Regional Council's Urban Center designation as the basis for distributing these boxes in King County.
<b>August 2012</b>	KCE responds to anticipated high voter turnout in a Presidential Election year by adding Ballot Drop-Off Vans to increase voters' return options- 15 total locations offered.
<b>August 2013</b>	KCE expands Ballot Drop-Off Van options to 12 and continues to operate ten 24-hour drop boxes and three Accessible Voting Centers for a total of 25 drop-off location options.

Cost estimates and comparisons between a permanent 24-hour box and a scheduled ballot drop-off van during a Countywide Election:

Operating twelve staffed ballot drop vans:	\$36,000
Operating ten 24-hour unstaffed ballot drop boxes:	\$16,000
