Dear Councilmember Upthegrove:

This letter transmits a proposed Ordinance in response to Ordinance 19546, Section 90, Proviso P1, and would, if adopted, implement changes to King County Code as recommended in the Code Enforcement Process Improvement and Proposed Title 23 Amendments Report also required by this Proviso. Approval of the proposed King County Code (KCC) amendments will help clarify and streamline the code enforcement processes to support reducing the length of time between initial complaint and resolution by the Department of Local Services (DLS). Notably, the report and a proposed Motion to acknowledge receipt are transmitted concurrently with this letter under separate cover.

Title 23 of the King County Code contains procedures for code enforcement, which is administered by staff within DLS, Permitting Division. The DLS Code Enforcement Unit investigates complaints regarding violations of KCC related to zoning, building, property maintenance, shorelines, and critical areas in unincorporated King County.

Proposed amendments include those which would:

- Prioritize code enforcement complaints;
- Distinguish between, and assess, different monetary penalties for residential and nonresidential code violations;
- Simplify appeals processes, by authorizing email as a notification method for contacting property owners and occupants; and
- Add additional sources of information such as map databases and aerial imagery that may be used as evidence for legal challenges.

Thank you for your consideration of this proposed Ordinance. The proposed updates to KCC would make effective use of limited resources to provide code enforcement services to unincorporated King County.
