6	WHEREAS, human trafficking	ng is a form of modern-day slavery in which people
7	profit from the control and exploitation	on of others, and
8	WHEREAS, as defined under	federal law, victims of human trafficking include
9	children involved in commercial sex trade, adults age eighteen or over who are coerced	
10	or deceived into commercial sex acts	and anyone forced into different forms of "labor or
11	services," such as domestic workers held in a home or farm workers forced to labor	
12	against their will, and	
13	WHEREAS, human traffickir	g is considered to be one of the fastest growing
14	criminal industries in the world, and	
15	WHEREAS, human traffickir	ng and the commercial sexual exploitation of
16	children are serious crime problems worldwide, in Washington state and in King County	
17	and	
18	WHEREAS, between three hi	undred and five hundred children will be bought and
19	sold in King County this year, and	Ħ

WHEREAS, the average age of entry into commercial sexual exploitation in the 20 United States is thirteen years old, and 21 WHEREAS, children as young as eleven years old who have been commercially 22 sexually exploited have been found in King County, and 23 WHEREAS, over ninety-five percent of labor and sex trafficking victims 24 experience physical and sexual violence, and 25 WHEREAS, human traffickers lure and ensnare individuals into labor trafficking 26 and sex trafficking situations using methods of control such as force, fraud or coercion, 27 28 and WHEREAS, human trafficking is a clandestine crime that thrives on secrecy and 29 on the social and physical isolation of its victims, making identification of victims, 30 traffickers and their networks extremely challenging, and 31 WHEREAS, the state of Washington has been described as a focal point for the 32 recruitment, transportation and sale of people for labor, due in part to its abundance of 33 ports, proximity to an international border, vast rural areas and dependency on 34 agricultural workers, and 35 WHEREAS, Washington was the first state to criminalize human trafficking, in 36 2003, and 37 WHEREAS, Washington state has some of the most comprehensive laws critical 38 to the fight against human trafficking, punishing traffickers and supporting survivors, and 39 is rated most outstanding by the National Human Trafficking Resource Center's Polaris 40 Project and 41

42	WHEREAS, as traffickers become more sophisticated and clandestine, law	
43	enforcement requires additional laws to strengthen its response, and	
44	WHEREAS, as victims of trafficking are in need of services and protection;	
45	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:	
46	The King County council urges the Washington state Legislature to enact
