Subject: MJ legislation - petitions in support for limiting MJ density in urban unincorporated areas

Greetings,

This notice is to inform you that approximated 215 signatures in support of limiting the density of marijuana businesses in North Highline and other urban unincorporated areas are being sent to the Clerk of the Council.

Thirty-one signatures were gathered on the Jubilee Days weekend at the booth staffed by the North Highline Unincorporated Area Council.

The remaining signatures were gathered on July 22-24 in North Highline and include signatures from business owners and the customers on 15th Ave SW who were not informed that 3 more marijuana retailers were coming to their block - all within 500 feet of each other.

These petitions support the concerns raised by Mark Johnston in the email pasted below for the technical changes to the county's recently passed marijuana legislation regarding the substantive differences between unincorporated area urban communities and those in east King County communities.

These petitions also support a request to the Council to disallow nonconforming uses of retail licensed locations within 1000 feet of each other in the interest of public welfare.

Not only does it appear that the numerous licenses in the unincorporated urban areas make them the most dense number of locations in the United States - in an area that already struggles socially and economically, but currently the state does not have a sufficient number of WSLCB enforcement and education officers to permanently assign one to these areas.

DPER is to be commended on actively objecting to the state's recent consideration of siting an 11th marijuana license in North Highline,

On a final note, anything the Council or Executive's office can do to more adequately engage the people who live and work in urban unincorporated areas would be greatly appreciated. Currently, it appears that only those who have sufficient time, energy, facility with English, and mobility are able to keep track of county activities, give input in a timely manner, and attend hearings - or if they have the resources to hire someone else to do so on their behalf.

Subject: Please help us make fairness true in King County's new marijuana policy next Monday

Dear Council member Gossett,

I thank you for taking a stand for the unincorporated communities of Skyway and White Center in recent council deliberations. The new 1,000 foot buffer between retail marijuana stores, we hope, will have a positive effect in our communities long term.

However, the council's action also reveals in stark contrast a two tiered system of fairness. Under the new zoning, it sets a limit for how many retail marijuana stores can be sited in any one of five county council districts, but it places no such limit in your district or in Joe McDermott's district. These other council districts far outstrip District 2 and District 8 in population. There should be a similar limit for all county council districts where unincorporated residents live.

I understand that at Monday's council meeting the new regulations will be brought up again for action on technical matters. I hope you will continue to support our communities by advocating for this simple addition of fairness to the county's regulations: District 2 and District 8 should have the same official limits on retail marijuana stores as all the other districts with unincorporated residents. It's the fair thing to do, and would help communities which have already been impacted by the siting of these stores from being further impact while the county studies the issues further.

I hope you will continue to be a strong advocate for Skyway and other unincorporated communities like it. Your strong advocacy is necessary in light of other coalitions on the council whose community advocacy doesn't always seem to see its way clearly over to the urban unincorporated areas.

Re: Reducing the high density of marijuana retail licenses in urban unincorporated King County (White Center, Top Hat, Skyway)

Recognizing that:

- (1) The King County Executive's Office has pledged to "regulate the production and sale of adult use marijuana in a way that reduces harm, protects youth, and profits legitimate, law-abiding, tax-paying businesses rather than criminals;"
- (2) A high density of marijuana stores in low income, urban neighborhoods conflicts with both youth prevention research on abuse and effective economic development;
- (4) The lack of county regulation for marijuana stores has resulted in over 75% of the approved retail marijuana licenses in unincorporated King County (14 of 17 licenses) being clustered together in urban areas containing 15% of the unincorporated population (White Center, Top Hat, Skyway) and the highest percentages of poverty and youth in the county;
- (5) The high concentration of marijuana stores in these urban areas creates additional problems of distribution and legal access for over 80% of the population living in greater unincorporated King County which has only 1 marijuana retail license;

We, the undersigned,

- (1) Request King County to continue the current moratorium on the opening of new stores licensed in 2016 which is set to expire on August 25, 2016, until equitable regulation can be put into place;
- (2) Request King County to prohibit the establishment of any marijuana retail operation within 1000 feet or more of any pre-existing licensed marijuana retail location, and require the relocation of any retail license presently located within such buffer zone;
- (3) Request King County to re-zone commercial areas such that marijuana retail licenses may be located in less urban Neighborhood Business zones as well as urban Community and Regional Business zones; and,
- (4) Request King County to implement educational and outreach programs to more effectively and fairly implement policy on marijuana regulation across the county.


