## Dear Councilmember Upthegrove:

This letter transmits a project status update on the King County public website replacement efforts as called for by Ordinance 19712, Section 86, P2. As outlined in the ordinance, the project status report includes: a description of the scope of work and overall timeline for the project; a list of activities that have been completed and remaining to be done; major milestones for activities remaining; and the total amount that has been spent on the project.

King County's website, <u>Kingcounty.gov</u>, is the primary digital information and communication tool for King County government. People who live, work, and play in King County, along with the media and other governments, rely on King County government's website to access information on everything King County does. Each department, agency, or office in the County has its own public-facing section of the site to communicate key information, provide links, etc., relevant to their respective, unique bodies of County work. KCIT provides the systems and platforms of Kingcounty.gov, while departments provide the content for the County's websites. The Kingcounty.gov continues to evolve over time, as technology advances and user needs and expectations expand.

King County has been using the Sitecore platform as the web content management system for Kingcounty.gov since 2006. In 2017, Sitecore announced that the version that King County was using would no longer be supported. As a result of this announcement, KCIT began planning an upgrade to a more recent version of Sitecore. As of August 18, 2023, Kingcounty.gov is running on Sitecore 10. Several departments have successfully transitioned their content to the new Sitecore 10 platform. However, content migration are department-driven efforts and depend on the ability of each department to allocate staff resources. KCIT estimates that work will continue through 2024 to fully deliver new user templates and test environments, automation, and other key features.
