September 24 (anticipated) – Transmittal of Executive Proposed 2013 Budget. Transmittal of Transportation Needs Report & School Capital Facilities Plans. Note: The public is given an opportunity to testify on these elements of the Comprehensive Plan in conjunction with review of the 2013 Budget.

November 19 (anticipated) – Public hearing at the full Council on 2013 Budget, including Capital Improvement Program.

November 19 (anticipated) – Final adoption of the School Capital Facilities Plans and Transportation Needs Report in conjunction with adoption of the 2013 Budget.
