| 8  | WHEREAS, Initiative 892 would legalize electronic scratch ticket machines at       |
| 9  | restaurants, taverns, bowling alleys and other establishments, and                 |
| 10 | WHEREAS, legalizing electronic scratch ticket machines would result in a near      |
| 11 | doubling of the amount of gambling in Washington state, and                        |
| 12 | WHEREAS, gambling expansion results in increased government and social costs       |
| 13 | to address theft, bankruptcy, homelessness, addictions, child neglect and domestic |
| 14 | violence, and  |
| 15 | WHEREAS, gambling expansion harms the poor, women and people of color in           |
| 16 | disproportionate numbers, and  |

| 17 | WHEREAS, Initiative 892 would override local laws restricting gambling and           |

| 18 | allow slot machines even in cities that have chosen to ban casinos, such as Seattle, |
| 19 | Bellevue and Bothell, and  |
| 20 | WHEREAS, Initiative 892 would allow slot machines in bars and restaurants            |
| 21 | which do not currently host casinos, thus bringing gambling to neighborhoods where   |
| 22 | such intense gambling is currently not permitted, and                                |
| 23 | WHEREAS, the highest priority of state government is to protect its citizens;        |
| 24 | NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:                           |
| 25 | The metropolitan King County council supports the preservation of local control      |
| 26 | of gambling in King County; and  |
| 27 | The metropolitan King County council is opposed to Initiative 892 and urges          |
