King County congratulates Sound Transit on its selection of a preferred site for its Link Light Rail Operations and Maintenance Satellite Facility (OMSF). King County understands that Sound Transit is moving forward with preliminary engineering and design work for a facility at this site.


Pursuant to the 2009 Public Multipurpose Easement, Section 2.1, King County by this letter is providing notification to Sound Transit that the County wishes to enter into negotiations to determine the size and location of the Trail Area within the Sound Transit-owned portion of the Eastside Rail Corridor (the "Sound Transit mile" in Bellevue), and particularly where adjacent to the proposed OMSF.
