NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Metropolitan King County Council (the Council) held a public hearing in the Council Chambers on the 10th Floor of the King County Courthouse (516 Third Avenue, Seattle, WA) on Wednesday, December 4, 2019, beginning at 9:30 AM. The purpose of this public hearing was to consider adoption of Proposed Ordinance 2019-0416 (Ordinance 19027) adopting the capital facilities plans of the Auburn, Enurnalaw, Federal Way, Fife, Highline, Issaauah, Kent, Northshore, Lake Washington, Renton, Riverview, Snayualmie Valley and Tahama School Districts for purposes of implementing the school impact fee program. The Council adopted the legislation at that meeting.

SUMMARY:

SUMMARY:

The Washington State Growth Management Act (GMA) authorizes local jurisdictions to collect impact fees as a method of financing public facilities (i.e., roads, parks and open space, schools) that become necessary as a result of new growth and development. King County administers the School impact Fee Program by collecting fees from residential development on behalf of each school district that chooses to participate (the program is voluntary). The fees are developed by the individual school districts in accordance with provisions in state law and the King County Code, and are set forth in the districts' copial facilities plans. The plans (and fees) are reviewed and adopted by the King County Council.

Ordinance 19027 amends Title 20 to update the school capital facilities plans and Title 27 to implement the collection of impact fees by the county on behalf of the following school districts, effective January 1, 2020:
