1	AN ORDINANCE approving the Lakenaven Utility
2,	District 1999 Comprehensive Wastewater System Plan, as
3	amended.

6	PREAMBLE:
7	K.C.C. chapter 13.24 requires approval of comprehensive plans for sewer
8	utilities as a prerequisite for granting right-of-way franchises and approval
9	of right-of-way construction permits.
10	The Lakehaven Utility District 1999 Comprehensive Wastewater System
11.	Plan (plan), as amended, discusses sewer service to existing and future
12	populations within the district's twenty-seven-square mile service area.
13	The service area currently includes portions of the cities of Federal Way,
14	Des Moines, Kent, Auburn, Milton, Pacific and Tacoma and parts of urban
15	unincorporated King County. The service area is comprised
16	predominantly of single-family residences, although multifamily
17	residences, commercial areas and industries are also served.

18	Approximately one hundred thousand residents and thirty-five thousand
19	employees are currently served by the district. By 2017, the residential
20	population projected to be served by the district is nearly one hundred fifty
21	thousand; approximately fifty thousand employees will be served.
22	The majority of the district's waste water flows are currently treated by the
23	district's two treatment plants, Lakota and Redondo. Some flows are
24	treated by Midway sewer district, by the city of Tacoma and by King
25	County. The quantity of waste water from the district that is treated by
26	King County's Renton treatment plan is currently and will remain at less
27	than one million gallons per day. The district's two treatment plants have
28	sufficient capacity to treat projected flows through 2017.
29	The district has recently completed several years of effort to reduce
30	infiltration and inflow in the Redondo basin. A reduction of
31	approximately three hundred thousand gallons per day was achieved.
32	A twenty-year capital program was identified at a cost of approximately
33	forty million dollars. Funding for the capital improvements will come
34	primarily from revenue bonds and developer funding for currently
35	unsewered areas.
36	The King County utilities technical review committee (UTRC) reviewed
37	and conditionally approved the plan on August 8, 2001. The conditions of
38	approval, technical changes to the plan, are reflected in the plan version
39.	attached to this ordinance. The UTRC recommends that the council
.40	approve the plan.

41	The plan was originally prepared in 1999 and subsequently amended. The
42	plan version attached to this ordinance contains the amendments
43	previously approved by the district.
44	The district prepared a determination of nonsignificance for the plan on
45	May 28, 1999, in accordance with the state Environmental Policy Act.
46	The district adopted the plan on July 8, 1999, and amended it on May 10,
47	2001.
48	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:
49	SECTION 1. The Lakehaven Utility District 1999 Comprehensive Wastewater

System Plan, as amended, Attachment A to this ordinance, is hereby approved without conditions.
