3 On page 1, beginning on line 5, strike everything through page 8, line 149, and insert:

4 "BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

5 SECTION 1. Ordinance 16999, Section 1, is hereby amended to read as follows:

6 The county assessor of King County has certified to the metropolitan King
7 County council that the assessed valuation of the County of King as finally equalized
8 amounts to \$((328,927,984,810)) 328,630,628,411.

9 SECTION 2. Ordinance 16999, Section 2, is hereby amended to read as follows:

10 The metropolitan King County council imposes the levies necessary to fund
11 estimated expenditures for the year 2011 as listed in this section. These amounts do not
12 include the total of estimated revenues from sources other than taxation, including
13 available surplus and such expenditures as are to be net from bond warrant issues. In
14 accordance with state law, the King County assessor calculated a sum for property taxes
15 available to the county related to new construction, improvements to property, refunds
16 and any increase in the assessed value of state assessed property. In calculating the
17 amount of regular property tax moneys needed, the council was cognizant of these sums

18 and they are therefore included in the following levy totals.

36 A. The metropolitan King County council imposes the levy necessary to fund
37 estimated expenditures for the year 2011 as listed in this section. This amount does not
38 include the total of estimated revenues from sources other than taxation, including
39 available surplus and such expenditures as are to be net from bond warrant issues. In
40 accordance with state law, the King County assessor calculated a sum for property taxes

41 available to the county related to new construction, improvements to property, refunds
 42 and any increase in the assessed value of state assessed property. In calculating the
 43 amount of regular property tax moneys needed, the council was cognizant of these sums
 44 and they are therefore included in the following levy totals.

47 B. If the levy amount set forth in subsection A. of this section would cause the
 48 combined lawful levies within any levy code area in the county that is located outside of
 49 the fire districts that are a party to the Interlocal Levy Agreement dated November 8,
 50 2010, which is Attachment A to this ordinance, to exceed either the constitutional or
 51 aggregate levy rate limitations under RCW 84.52.043, or both, the county instead levies
 52 this tax for collection in 2011 in an amount equal to the maximum amount which may be
 53 levied without causing any reduction to the levy of the flood district due to those levy
 54 code areas under RCW 84.52.010, in accordance with the Interlocal Levy Agreement
 55 attached to this ordinance.

56 SECTION 4. Ordinance 16999, Section 4, is hereby amended to read as follows:
