1 AN ORDINANCE approving the Soos Creek Water &
2 Sewer District Comprehensive Water System Plan and
3 Sewer Comprehensive Plan.

6 PREAMBLE:

7 K.C.C. chapter 13.24 requires approval of comprehensive plans for water
8 and sewer utilities as a prerequisite for granting right-of-way franchises
9 and approval of right-of-way construction permits.

10 RCW 43.20.260 requires that water system plans for any new industrial,
11 commercial, or residential use are to be consistent with the requirements
12 of any comprehensive plans or development regulations adopted under
13 chapter 36.70A RCW or any other applicable comprehensive plan, land
14 use plan, or development regulation adopted by a city, town, or county for
15 the service area.

16 The Soos Creek water and sewer district ("district") currently provides
17 water service to approximately fifty thousand residents, several schools

18 and businesses and sewer service to approximately eighty-thousand
19 residents. The district is located in the southeast portion of King County.
20 The district obtains its water from Seattle Public Utilities. The average
21 annual water demand is currently approximately 4.1 million gallons per
22 day. The demand is projected to increase to about 5.6 million gallons per
23 day in 2023, assuming a modest water conservation reduction of one
24 percent per year.

25 The district is planning a water system capital improvement program
26 valued at approximately \$61,000,000 over the long-term planning period.
27 The capital improvements proposed include modifications to the storage
28 and distribution systems. The district also is planning sewer system
29 capital improvements of approximately \$34 million for the long-term
30 planning period.

31 The King County utilities technical review committee ("UTRC") reviewed
32 and conditionally approved the plan on December 8, 2004. The conditions
33 of approval have been met in the plan with copies attached to this
34 ordinance. The UTRC recommends that the King County council approve
35 the plan.

36 A determination of non-significance for the plan was issued by the district
37 on September 22, 2004, in accordance with the state Environmental Policy
38 Act.

39 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

40 SECTION 1. The Soos Creek Water & Sewer District Comprehensive Water
41 System Plan and Sewer Comprehensive Plan, Attachments A and B to this ordinance, are
42 hereby approved.




