1 AN ORDINANCE approving the city of Kent 2000
2 Comprehensive Sewer Plan.

5 PREAMBLE:

6 K.C.C. chapter 13.24 requires approval of comprehensive plans for sewer utilities
7 as a prerequisite for granting right-of-way franchises and approval of right-of-way
8 construction permits.

9 The city of Kent 2000 Comprehensive Sewer Plan (plan) discusses sewer service
10 to existing and future populations within the city's twenty-five-square-mile service area.
11 The service area currently includes most of the city of Kent, a small area in the city of
12 SeaTac, and parts of urban unincorporated King County. The service area is nearly
13 evenly split between single- and multifamily residences, and commercial and industrial
14 areas. Approximately seventy thousand residents are currently served by the city. At
15 buildout, the population projected to be served by the city could be over one hundred fifty
16 thousand.

17 All of the city's wastewater flows are treated by King County. The quantity of
18 wastewater from the city that is treated by King County is currently approximately five
19 million gallons per day. At buildout, that amount may nearly double.

20 The city is working with King County to measure and reduce infiltration and
21 inflow into its sewer system.

22 A six-year capital program was identified at a cost of approximately five million
23 dollars. Funding for the capital improvements will come primarily from revenue bonds
24 and developer funding for currently unsewered areas.

25 The King County utilities technical review committee originally reviewed the
26 plan on September 20, 2000. After extensive revisions, the utilities technical review
27 committee again reviewed the plan on October 10, 2001, and approved it. The utilities
28 technical review committee recommends that the council approve the plan.

29 The city prepared a determination of non-significance for the plan on March 30,
30 1999, in accordance with the state Environmental Policy Act. The city adopted the plan
31 on February 16, 1999.

32 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

33 SECTION 1. The city of Kent 2000 Comprehensive Sewer Plan, Attachment A
34 to this ordinance, is hereby approved without conditions.




