#### BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

#### **SECTION 1.** Findings:

- 1. The city of Redmond, Washington, by Resolution 1152 has determined that it is in the public interest and general welfare to provide for the annexation of an area known as Northeast Rose Hill Annexation, in accordance with chapter 35A.14 RCW.
- City of Redmond Resolution 1152 satisfies the provisions of chapter 35A.14
   RCW for qualification for annexation.
- 3. The city of Redmond, by Resolution 1152, initiated the annexation of the Northeast Rose Hill annexation area.

17	4. The King County boundary review board received a request for review under
18	chapter 36.93 RCW, and on November 14, 2000, the review board, in file 2082, deemed
19	the proposed city of Redmond Northeast Rose Hill annexation file approved as modified.
20	5. Pursuant to chapters 29.13 and 35A.14 RCW, the metropolitan King County
21	council deems an emergency exists for the purpose of calling a special election to be held

on the question of this annexation on September 17, 2002.

SECTION 2. A special election shall be held on the 17th day of September 2002 in accordance with chapter 35A.14 RCW within the territory of the proposed annexation, for the purpose of submitting the question of annexation of the Northeast Rose Hill annexation area and whether or not all property in the annexation area will assume its proportionate share of existing city bonded indebtedness.

SECTION 3. The number of registered voters within the subject area is estimated at 303 as nearly as may be determined from available records.

SECTION 4. It is hereby found that an urgent need exists for the consideration by the electors of the proposed annexation. Pursuant to RCW 29.13.010 and 35A.14.050, it is hereby deemed that an emergency exists. The King County manager of the records, elections and licensing services division is hereby requested to assume jurisdiction to call and conduct a special election and submit to the registered voters within the subject area the proposition as set forth in section 4 of this ordinance. The clerk of the council is hereby authorized and directed to transmit said proposition to the manager of records and elections in substantially the following form, with such additions, deletions or modifications in the ballot title as may be required for the proposition listed below by the King County prosecutor:

54	division, is hereby authorized and requested to prepare and distribute a local voters'	
55	pamphlet, pursuant to K.C.C. 1.10.010, for the special election called for in this	
56	ordinance, the cost of the pamphlet to be included as part of the cost of the special	
57	election.	
58	SECTION 6. The boundaries of the territory proposed for annexation are hereby	
59	described in city of Redmond Resolution 1152 as contained in Attachment A to this	
50	ordinance.	
51	SECTION 7. In order for this ordinance to be effective in the time required by	
52	law for this item to be on the September 17, 2002, ballot this ordinance must be enacted	

by an emergency. The council, there	fore, finds as a fact and declares that an emergency
exists and that this ordinance is neces	ssary for the immediate preservation of public peace
health, or safety or for the support of	county government and existing public institutions.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON, CALLING FOR AN ELECTION ON THE QUESTION OF ANNEXING 184 ACRES OF LAND LOCATED SOUTH OF N.B. 108<sup>TH</sup> STREET, NORTH OF 93<sup>TH</sup> STREET, EAST OF 132<sup>TH</sup> AVENUE NE, AND WEST OF WILLOWS ROAD COMMONLY KNOWN AS THE NE ROSE HILL ANNEXATION; AND PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION OF A PROPOSITION TO THE VOTERS OF SAID ANNEXATION AREA REQUIRING THE PROPERTY TO BE ASSESSED AND TAXED AT THE SAME RATE AND ON THE SAME BASIS AS OTHER PROPERTY WITHIN THE CITY UPON ANNEXATION.

WHEREAS, on September 11, 1998, the City of Redmond received a Notice of Intent to annex certain real property commonly known as the Northeast Rose Hill Annexation; and

WHEREAS, the initial Notice of Intent was signed by the owners of the property representing at least 10 percent (10%) in value (according to the assessed valuation for general taxation) for an annexation within the Northeast Rose Hill area; and

WHEREAS, on January 5, 1999, the City Council met with the initiators of the annexation, accepted the Notice of Intent subject to certain conditions, and authorized circulation of an annexation petition; and

WHEREAS, on September 29, 1999, the City Council received an annexation petition containing the signatures of the owners of not less than sixty percent (60%) in value,

according to the assessed valuation for general taxation, of the property, for which annexation was petitioned; and

WHEREAS, on March 6, 2000, the City Council determined that the property should be subject to the Redmond Community Development Guide and subject to a requirement that the property be assessed and taxed at the same rate as other property in the City, and that the cost of providing sewer and water utility service be funded by the developer or the owners of the property; and

WHEREAS, on November 14, 2000, the Washington State Boundary Review Board for King County completed the Resolution and Hearing Decision, as specified in RCW 36.93, to approve the Northeast Rose Hill Annexation, and modified the boundaries to the annexation area shown on Exhibit 1 and described in Exhibit 2; and

WHEREAS, on March 14, 2002, while the Planning Commission was reviewing the Willows/Rose Hill Neighborhood Plan and prior to the City Council's completion of the annexation, the Washington Supreme Court issued its decision in <u>Grant County Fire Protection</u>

<u>District No. 5 v. City of Moses Lake</u>, in which the Court determined that the petition method of annexation is invalid; and

WHEREAS, the only method of annexation available to cities at the present time is the election method of annexation, and the City Council has determined that, given the level of interest in annexation evidenced by the Notice of Intent, and testimony from neighborhood residents, that an election should be called; and

WHEREAS, the City Council adopted on June 11, 2002, the neighborhood plan, regulations and pre-annexation zoning for the Northeast Rose Hill Annexation area, now, therefore,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDMOND, WASHINGTON, HEREBY RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Call for Election. Pursuant to RCW 35A.14.015, the City Council hereby calls for an election to be held in order to submit a proposal to the voters of the territory commonly known as the NE Rose Hill Annexation Area for annexation to the City of Redmond. The City Council hereby finds that such annexation would serve the best interests and general welfare of the City.

Section 2. <u>Election Date</u>. The City Council respectfully requests that the Director of the King County Department of Records and Elections set the election called for in Section 1 for September 17, 2002.

Section 3. Description of Boundaries. The boundaries of the NE Rose Hill Annexation Area are shown on the map, Exhibit 1, and described as set forth in Exhibit 2, and attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference as if set forth in full.

Section 4. Voters. The number of voters residing within the area to be annexed, as nearly as may be reasonably estimated, 303.

Section 5. Cost of Election. The City of Redmond will pay the cost of the annexation election.

Section 6. Assessment and Taxation. Pursuant to RCW 35A.14.085, at the same election and within the same proposition as called for in Section 1, the question shall be submitted to the electorate of the NE Rose Hill Annexation Area specifying that all property within such territory shall, upon annexation, be assessed and taxed at the same rate and on the same basis as the other property within the City is assessed and taxed to pay for the thenoutstanding indebtedness.

Section 7. <u>Ballot Propositions</u>. The City Attorney and City Clerk are hereby directed to work with the King County Department of Records and Elections in order to draft the ballot propositions to be submitted to the voters as provided in Sections 1 and 6 above.

Section 8. Certified Copies. The City Clerk is authorized and directed to file certified copies of this Resolution with the King County Council, the Washington State Boundary Review Board for King County, and the King County Department of Records and Elections.
