1 AN ORDINANCE ratifying the executive emergency
2 budget crisis proclamation.

3 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

4 SECTION 1. Findings:

5 A. On February 29, 2020, the Governor of Washington state declared a state of
6 emergency in all counties in Washington state and directed that the plans and procedures
7 of the Washington State Comprehensive Emergency Management Plan be implemented
8 as a result of coronavirus disease 2019 ("COVID-19") outbreak and confirmation of
9 person-to-person spread in Washington state.

10 B. COVID-19 is a respiratory disease that is classified by the World Health
11 Organization as a pandemic that spreads easily from person to person and may result in
12 serious illness or death.

13 C. On March 1, 2020, the executive issued a proclamation of emergency enabling
14 extraordinary measures to respond to the COVID-19 outbreak. On March 3, 2020, the
15 council passed Motion 15610, affirming the proclamation of emergency.

16 D. As a result of the continued worldwide spread of COVID-19, its significant
17 progression in Washington state and the high risk it poses to our most-vulnerable
18 populations, on March 23, 2020, the Governor issued a "Stay Home - Stay Healthy" order
19 prohibiting, with limited exceptions, all people in Washington state from leaving their

20 homes or participating in social, spiritual and recreational gatherings of any kind
21 regardless of the number of participants, and required all nonessential businesses in
22 Washington state to cease operations except for performing basic minimal operations. In
23 describing COVID-19's impact on public health and the economy, the order noted the
24 pandemic's progression in Washington state that continues to threaten the economy and
25 remains a public disaster affecting life, health, property or the public peace. The order
26 has been extended twice, currently set to expire May 31, 2020.

27 E. The Stay Home - Stay Healthy order and the related public safety preventative
28 measures, including social distancing are causing devastating economic effects in
29 Washington and across the nation.

30 F. The county is experiencing extraordinary and unprecedented economic
31 conditions and severe fiscal challenges across all county funds, which is resulting in a
32 significant shortfall in the amount of funding needed to sustain the current level of
33 general operations through 2020.

34 G. The countywide March taxable sales collections in March 2020 were twenty-
35 four percent less than March 2019.

36 H. With reduced revenues forecasted for the remainder of 2020 and thereafter,
37 the county is working hard to find innovative ways to gain efficiencies in all county
38 functions in order to minimize service reductions to the public.

39 I. The current circumstance is such that projected county revenues are forecasted
40 and determined to be insufficient to fully fund county agency operations and significant
41 costs savings must be achieved through reductions in service and pay.

42 SECTION 2. The executive has proclaimed that an emergency budget crisis

43 exists for the remainder of the 2019-2020 budget biennium. The council hereby ratifies
44 the executive's proclamation.
