AN ORDINANCE declaring a one-year moratorium prohibiting the acceptance of applications for or establishment of new or expansion of existing wineries, breweries, distilleries and remote tasting rooms, as primary uses or as home occupations or home industries; and prohibiting temporary use permits for wineries, breweries, distilleries and remote tasting room; establishing a work plan to evaluate the next steps for the regulations regarding these uses; and declaring an emergency.

On 6/22/2021, the Metropolitan King County Council Passed as Amended.

Public Hearing Required

On an emergency basis, the King County Council adopted Ordinance 19309 on June 22, 2021. The ordinance established a one year moratorium prohibiting the acceptance of applications for or establishment of new or expansion of existing wineries, breweries, distilleries and remote tasting rooms, as primary uses or as home occupations or home industries; and prohibiting temporary use permits for wineries, breweries, distilleries and remote tasting room. In accordance with state law, a public hearing is required to be held within sixty days of the adoption of the moratorium. The ordinance has been advertised for a public hearing on August 17, 2021.
