1	AN ORDINANCE relating to extending the period for
2	building permit approvals and amending Ordinance 12560,
3	Section 18, as amended, and K.C.C. 16.02.290.
4	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:
5	SECTION 1. Findings.
6	1. Over the past several years, King County has been looking for ways to
7	revitalize our local and regional economy, especially in regards to the housing meltdown
8	that is a key element of our local economic crisis.
9	2. On December 15, 2008, the Council adopted Motion 12901 to promote
10	housing development, preserve and enhance the housing supply in King County, and
11	ultimately create jobs and generate revenue for our jurisdiction.
12	3. On May 11, 2009, the Council adopted Ordinance 16515 to extend building
13	permit approval periods because of poor economic conditions and difficulty in obtaining
14	construction financing.
15	4. Poor economic conditions persist to this day and construction financing
16	remains difficult to obtain.
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18	5. A number of housing and building projects, which have been approved by
19	King County, have continued to be delayed due to little movement of the existing
20	housing inventory and are in a position of having to restart the development process
21	because their permit approval periods are nearing an end. Restarting these projects will
22	add to the cost of housing units, thereby contributing to keeping the housing market
23	depressed.
24	SECTION 2. Ordinance 12560, Section 18, as amended, and K.C.C. 16.02.290
25	are each hereby amended to read as follows:
26	Section 105.5 of the International Building Code is not adopted and the following
27	is substituted:
28	Expiration (IBC 105.5). Every permit issued by the building official under the
29	provisions of the Code shall expire by limitation and become null and void one year from
30	date of issue. Issued permits may be extended for one year periods subject to the
31	following conditions:
32	1. An application for a permit extension together with the applicable fee is
33	submitted to the department of development and environmental services at least seven
34	(7), but no more than sixty (60), calendar days prior to the date the original permit
35	becomes null and void. Once the permit extension application is submitted, work may
36	continue past the expiration date of the original permit, provided that the extension
37	application is not denied. If the extension application is denied, all work must stop until a
38	valid permit is obtained.
39	2. If construction of a building or structure has not substantially commenced, as

determined by the building official, within two years from the date of the first issued

41	permit and the building and the structure is no longer authorized by the zoning code or
42	other applicable law, then the permit shall not be extended.
43	3. An applicant may request a total of two permit extensions provided there are
44	no substantial changes in the approved plans and specifications.
45	4. The building official may extend a building permit beyond the second
46	extension only to allow completion of a building, structure or mechanical system
47	authorized by the original permit and substantially constructed. If substantial work, as
48	determined by the building official, has not commenced on a building and/or structure
49	authorized in the original permit, then a new permit will be required for construction to
50	proceed.
51	EXCEPTION: Until December 31, ((2011))2012, the building official may grant
52	a third or fourth extension for building permits where substantial work has not
53	commenced, if:
54	1. The applicant makes a written request to the building official for an extension
55	of the building permit;
56	2. The applicant pays applicable permit extension fees; and
57	3. There are no substantial changes in the approved plans or specifications,
57 58	3. There are no substantial changes in the approved plans or specifications,5. The staff of the department of development and environmental services may

- permit at the permittee's request, but such a revision does not constitute a renewal or
- otherwise extend the life of the permit.
