- Collaborative and user-focused continual improvement is necessary


Civil protection orders

Civil protection orders

- Intended to be accessible to self-represented participants
 - Petitioners
 - Respondents

Effectiveness of orders


Full protection orders effective in reducing violence

Temporary orders may not have same


effectiveness

Recommendations

- Track more detailed data about outcomes
- Use data analysis to improve processes and address disparities

Key barriers to protection order access

- Limited assistance for self-represented participants
- Limited language support
- Need for user-focused and collaborative continual improvement

Limited assistance for participants

- Attorneys and advocates can mitigate barriers
- Most petitioners do not have an attorney or a personal advocate
- Clerk's Office assists with process-related questions

Recommendation

Develop and implement a plan to increase resources for self-represented petitioners

Limited language support

- No language support for navigating virtual hearing process
- Required forms must be completed in English
- Some guidance available in English only
- Protection orders available in English only

Recommendations

- Update language access plan
- Ensure key forms and instructions are available in other languages
- Expand language support in virtual hearings
- Communicate language support options

Need for continual improvement

- Individuals working to improve processes
- Challenges in collaborating with the courts
- No court-led effort to coordinate and facilitate continual improvement
- Need for user input into development of improvements

Recommendations

- Create a workgroup or collaborative mechanism
- Collaborate with stakeholders to address user challenges
- Ensure effective implementation of statewide reforms
