64	SECTION 1. A. Sections 2 through 45 of this ordinance propose changes in the
65	fees currently charged related to the department of development and environmental
66	services.
67	B. These fees are assessed under K.C.C. 2.99.030E.1.
68	SECTION 2. Ordinance 10662, Section 44, and K.C.C. 27.02.030 are each
69	hereby amended to read as follows:
70	A. Fees are due and payable at the time of application for service or the due date
71	stated on the department's invoice.
72	B. A late penalty payment equal to one percent of the delinquent unpaid balance,
73	compounded monthly, shall be assessed on any delinquent unpaid balance.
74	C. The department shall charge an insufficient funds charge of ((twenty-five))
75	thirty-five dollars.
76	SECTION 3. Ordinance 10662, Section 46, and K.C.C. 27.02.050 are each
77	hereby amended to read as follows:
78	Unless otherwise required by this title, development permit and environmental
79	review fees shall be assessed at the fee rate in effect at the time the fee is ((collected))
80	assessed.
81	SECTION 4. Ordinance 10662, Section 47, as amended, and K.C.C. 27.02.060
82	are each hereby amended to read as follows:
83	((Counter service and administrative)) If an applicant withdraws, cancels or
84	otherwise terminates a permit application, permit administration fees paid under K.C.C.
35	27.06.020 are not refundable. If the applicant withdraws, cancels or otherwise terminates
36	the application and makes a written request for a refund within thirty days of the date the

87	fee was paid, $((\Theta))$ other fixed service fees are refundable in proportion to the amount of
. 88	work performed as of the date of application withdrawal by the applicant.
89	SECTION 5. Ordinance 10662, Section 49, as amended, and K.C.C. 27.02.080
90	are each hereby amended to read as follows:
91	A. A ((flat)) <u>fixed</u> fee of two hundred ((five)) <u>thirty</u> dollars shall be charged for
92	department staff time associated with all work done in conjunction with the ((setting,))
93	intake, administration and release of financial guarantees for development permits.
94	B. A fee assessed at the department's current hourly rate shall be charged for
95	department staff time associated with all work done in conjunction with the setting,
96	monitoring, inspection and enforcement of financial guarantees for development permits
97	SECTION 6. Ordinance 13332, Section 8, and K.C.C. 27.02.130 are each hereby
98	amended to read as follows:
99	A. ((Education and training fees)) The department may ((be charged for)) charge
100	a fee to recover the actual cost of providing classes or training provided by department of
101	development and environmental services staff. ((The fees shall be charged at competitive
102	market rates, and educational income may be less than or greater than all costs of
103	preparing and presenting class. Class and training costs include, but are not limited to,
104	the costs for planning, research, class preparation, class materials, notification,
105	advertising, facility arrangements, related meetings, printing, presenting, follow-up and
106	similar costs as applicable to the total cost of providing the service.
107	B. Fees for classes shall range from approximately twenty five dollars daily per
108	attendee to one hundred thirty five dollars daily per attendee depending upon class

109	content, length of class and number of attendees. Individual training may be provided at
110	the department's current hourly rate.))
111	SECTION 7. Ordinance 13332, Section 10, and K.C.C. 27.02.140 are each
112	hereby amended to read as follows:
113	Whenever any work for which a permit or application approval required under
114	K.C.C. Title 16, 19A, 20, 21A or 25 has commenced without first obtaining the required
115	permit or application approval or has proceeded without obtaining necessary inspections,
116	an investigation fee, in addition to the permit or application review fee, shall be collected
117	whether or not a permit or application approval is subsequently issued. Except as
118	otherwise provided in K.C.C. 27.10.090 for grading or clearing without a permit, ((Ŧ))the
119	investigation fee shall be equal to the amount of the permit or application fee required by
120	this title.
121	SECTION 8. Ordinance 13332, Section 12, and K.C.C. 27.02.150 are each
122	hereby amended to read as follows:
123	All plan revisions submitted by the applicant shall be charged a fee at the
124	department's current hourly rate and applying any increase in the valuation of the
125	construction work, as applicable.
126	SECTION 9. Ordinance 13332, Section 13, as amended, and K.C.C. 27.02.160
127	are each hereby amended to read as follows:
128	A. The department may collect nonpermit-related fees for services including, but
129	not limited to, making copies, providing letters of zoning certification, notarizing
130	documents, gathering, preparing((5)) and publishing special request reports, and providing
131	publications. The fees shall be at actual cost to the department and shall be collected at

132	the time services are requested. The department shall publish an annual schedule of thes
133	fees.
134	B. ((Special requests concerning addressing issues that require staff time for
135	research or site visits shall be charged at the department's current hourly rate.)) The fee
136	for a duplicate copy of a previously prepared certificate of elevation is two hundred
137	dollars.
138	NEW SECTION. SECTION 10. A new section is hereby added to K.C.C.
139	chapter 27.02 to read as follows:
140	Requests concerning residential addressing issues shall be charged one hundred
141	thirty-six dollars per address. Requests concerning nonresidential addressing issues shall
142	be charged at the department's current hourly rate.
143	SECTION 11. Ordinance 13332, Section 9, as amended, and K.C.C. 27.02.190
144	are each hereby amended to read as follows:
145	A. Except as otherwise provided in subsections B and C of this section, the
146	department's current hourly rate shall be assessed under this title at a rate of one hundred
147	((forty)) seventy dollars per hour.
148	B. Land use permits for agricultural activities on RA-zoned property for which
149	the property owner has a current farm plan developed in conjunction with the King
150	Conservation District or on lands within the agricultural production district shall be
151	subject to an hourly rate of ((seventy)) eighty-five dollars ((to a maximum of four
152	hundred twenty-two dollars)).
153	C. Building permits for agricultural buildings shall be subject to an hourly rate of
154	((seventy)) eighty-five dollars.

155	D. For purposes of this section, "agricultural building" means a structure, other
156	than a dwelling, that is:
157	1. Located on RA-zoned property for which the property owner has a current
158	farm plan developed in conjunction with the King Conservation District or on lands
159	within the agricultural production district; and
160	2. Used in the operation of the farm for:
161	a. Storage, maintenance or repair of farm machinery and equipment;
162	b. The raising, harvesting and selling of crops;
163	c. The feeding, breeding, management and sale of, or the produce of, livestock
164	poultry, fur-bearing animals or honeybees;
165	d. Dairying and the sale of dairy products;
166	e. Any other agricultural or horticultural use or animal husbandry, or any
167	combination thereof, including the preparation, storage, processing, or sale of agricultural
168	products raised on the farm for human use and animal use;
169	f. Processing, treatment, packaging, and sale of agricultural products;
170	g. Stabling or training equines; or
171	h. Equine riding lessons and training clinics.
172	NEW SECTION. SECTION 12. A new section is hereby added to K.C.C.
173	chapter 27.02 to read as follows:
174	A. Except as otherwise provided in subsection B. of this section, the department
175	shall assess a surcharge of five percent on all fees established in K.C.C. chapters 27.02,
176	27.06, 27.10, 27.36 and 27.46 and K.C.C. 27.44.010B. The surcharge shall only be used
177	to fund:

178	1. The permit integration project;
179	2. Relocation of the department's permitting related functions; and
180	3. The department's undesignated fund balance for working capital in order to
181	achieve an undesignated fund balance of forty-six days of operating and maintenance
182	expenses.
183	B. The following fees shall not be subject to the surcharge established in
184	subsection A. of this section:
185	1. Late payment penalty and insufficient funds penalty fees established in

193	7. Fees or surcharges established by and remitted to the state of Washington.
194	C. The surcharge applies to fee assessments made between January 1, 2011 and
195	January 1, 2015.
196	D. This section expires on January 1, 2015.
