1	A MOTION requesting the King County executive			
2	establish a cannabis business security task force to develop			
3	strategies to prevent criminal activity targeting cannabis			
4	businesses and address security concerns at cannabis			
5	businesses and to provide a report.			
6	WHEREAS, King County has experienced an increase in criminal activity,			
7	including armed robbery, targeting cannabis businesses over the last year, and			
8	WHEREAS, according to the Washington Cannabusiness Association, roughly			
9	eighty robberies have been recorded at cannabis retailers across the state of Washington			
10	since the beginning of 2022, and			
11	WHEREAS, federal law prohibits cannabis related businesses from accessing			
12	traditional banking services, forcing these businesses to operate on a cash-only basis and			
13	making them a target for criminals, and			
14	WHEREAS, while King County has traditionally allocated its portion of cannabis			
15	excise tax revenue collected by the state in accordance with RCW 69.54.540 to law			
16	enforcement activities by the King County sheriff's office, in 2020, the executive			
17	proposed, and the council approved, redirecting cannabis excise tax revenues away from			
18	the sheriff's office and toward community-based programs within the department of local			
19	services and the department of community and human services, and			

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20	WHEREAS, criminal activity targeting cannabis businesses impacts the broader		
21	community, and		
22	WHEREAS, a coordinated cannabis-business-security effort is required to prevent		
23	crimes against cannabis businesses and to ensure the safety and security of communities		
24	across King County;		
25	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:		
26	A. The council requests the King County executive address the recent increase in		
27	criminal activity targeting cannabis businesses across King County by establishing a		
28	cannabis business security task force to develop strategies to prevent that criminal		
29	activity and to prepare a report.		
30	B. The task force should consist of representatives, including, but not limited to:		
31	1. The King County prosecuting attorney's office;		
32	2. The King County sheriff's office;		
33	3. Cannabis business owners and employees; and		
34	4. Impacted neighborhood groups and community organizations.		
35	C. The task force should consider strategies including, but not limited to:		
36	1. Identifying and providing the resources necessary to aid law enforcement in		
37	the prevention of criminal activity targeting cannabis businesses, including the use of		
38	cannabis excise tax revenues to prevent and mitigate community impacts of cannabis		
39	business related crimes;		
40	2. Deepening interjurisdictional cooperation and data sharing to identify trends		
41	in criminal activity targeting cannabis businesses; and		

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42	3. Coordinating emphasis patrols by law enforcement officers in the vicinity of		
43	cannabis business locations across King County.		
44	D. The report should include, but not be limited to:		
45	1. A listing and description of cannabis business security and crime prevention		
46	strategies and techniques that will be developed and implemented to reduce criminal		
47	activity targeting cannabis businesses across King County and an estimated timeline for		
48	their implementation; and		
49	2. An analysis of the need for additional staff and resources across King County		
50	government departments and agencies to develop and implement cannabis business		
51	security and crime prevention efforts as well as a fiscal note summarizing the budget		
52	need to support these efforts.		
53	E. The King County executive should electronically file the report not later than		
54	August 31, 2022, with the clerk of the council, who shall retain the original and provide		

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- an electronic copy to all councilmembers and the lead staff of the law and justice
- 56 committee, or its successor.
