1 AN ORDINANCE proposing an amendment to the King 2 County Charter to move elections for certain county offices 3 from odd-numbered to even-numbered years; amending 4 Sections 640, 647 and 650.20 of the King County Charter 5 and repealing Sections 650.40.15, 650.40.25 and 660 of the 6 King County Charter; and submitting the same to the voters 7 of the county for their ratification or rejection at the 8 November 8, 2022, general election. 9 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY: 10 SECTION 1. There shall be submitted to the qualified voters of King County for 11 their approval and ratification or rejection, at the November 8, 2022, general election, an 12 amendment to Sections 640, 647 and 650.20 of the King County Charter and a repeal of 13 Sections 650.40.15, 650.40.25 and 660 of the King County Charter, as set forth herein: 14 Section 640 County Executive and Assessor. 15 The county executive and county assessor shall be ((nominated and)) elected as 16 nonpartisan offices by the voters of the county. The ((nomination and)) election of the 17 county executive and county assessor shall be held ((every four years as a county general 18 election at the same time as the general election for cities in the county)) at the primary and 19 general elections in 2023 for the county assessor and 2025 for the county executive and

Section 647 County Director of Elections, Term of Office and Compensation

shall occur ((at the general election in 2011 and)) at the primary and general elections in		
2023 and then in even-numbered years commencing in 2026 and every four years		
thereafter. The county director of elections shall receive compensation as provided by		
ordinance.
