Dear Councilmember Balducci:

This letter transmits a proposed Motion that would, if approved, authorize King County to accept a donation in the amount of \$50,000 from the Foothills Trail Coalition, a non-profit organization, for the funding and construction of the Foothills Trail Segment B. The Coalition promotes the creation, maintenance, and usage of a connected system of nonmotorized trails. The proposed Ordinance has no fiscal impact.

King County is working cooperatively with the cities of Buckley and Enumclaw, and Pierce County Parks, to construct a new non-motorized bridge over the White River, a vital community amenity that connects the completed portions of the trail in Enumclaw and Buckley.

As part of King County's 175-mile regional trail system, the proposed Foothills Trail Segment B addition would connect communities and provide opportunities for recreation that can reduce health factors linked to obesity, diabetes, chronic illness, and reduced life expectancy. The addition of Foothills Trail Segment B also supports economic and civic growth by connecting local businesses to non-motorized transportation options for their customers and employees. By improving access and safety, and by creating a more inviting place to recreate and recharge, the Foothills Trail can become a gathering place and focal point for the community. To help complete the proposed project, the Foothills Trail Coalition is donating \$50,000 in funding for the design and construction of the bridge.

This proposed legislation furthers the mobility goal of the King County Strategic Plan by delivering a safe, reliable, and seamless network of transportation options to get people where they need to go, when they need to get there. Execution of the agreement would also further the facility and system improvement goals of the Equity and Social Justice Strategic Plan, by providing access to safe and efficient non-motorized transportation and more equitable access to recreation for all ages and abilities in a part of the county that has been historically underserved by regional parks and trails. Finally, by providing increased opportunity for use of

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non-motorized transportation, construction of the Foothills Trail supports the Strategic Climate Action Plan goal of providing and encouraging the use of sustainable transportation choices.

Thank you for your consideration of this proposed Motion. This proposed legislation will give residents increased access to an interconnected, non-motorized, active transportation network for more efficient mobility and safe and healthy recreation.
