## AMENDMENT TO PROPOSED ORDINANCE 2022-0439, VERSION 2

- 2 On page 3, after line 24, insert:
- 3 "C.1. Authorization to execute the interlocal agreement for jail services with

2. The council shall have thirty days from receipt of the executive's letter to adopt a motion restricting the expansion of the number of King County inmates housed at South Correctional Entity, after which if a motion is not adopted by the council the executive is authorized to expand the number of King County inmates housed at South Correctional Entity."

EFFECT prepared by Leah Krekel-Zoppi: This amendment is dependent upon passage of Amendment 4. It would limit the number of King County inmates at SCORE to no more than 60 per day until the Executive provides this first report required under Amendment 3 and transmits a letter stating the Executive's intention to expand the number of people housed at SCORE. The Council would then have 30 days to pass a motion prohibiting the expansion otherwise the Executive would be authorized to

increase the number of people housed at SCORE.
