

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Three objectives:

- Reduce risks from flood and channel migration hazards
- Minimize the environmental impacts of flood projects
- Reduce long term
 maintenance costs

What doesn't change in this Flood Plan Update ?

- No new policies
- No changes to goals or objectives
- No changes to capital priorities

Flood Plan Update fulfills requirements of NFIP Community Rating System :

- Class 2 Community
- Up to a 40% discount in flood insurance
- Annual savings of \$830,256 to unincorporated area flood insurance policyholders



2007 – 2012 Success by the numbers


- 70 projects to reduce flood risks
- 50 homes and 3 agricultural structures elevated since 1993
- 26 farm pads built for flood refuge
- 100 properties / 287 acres to move people from harms way
- 5200 Flood Alert subscribers

IN THE EVENT OF A FLOOD

- Monitor area news.
 Move vehicles and equipment to higher ground.
- Do not walk or drive through standing water or closed roads.
 Listen for alerts about evacuation
- Listen for alerts about evacuation notices and routes. Heed evacuation instructions.
- 5. Bring medications and supplies with you.
 6. Relocate animals and livestock, if needed.



Accomplishment: Sammamish Transition Zone Maintenance

1500 linear feet Increased flow capacity Controls lake level

Accomplishment: Tolt Emergency Repair

2009 levee breach both banks
650 linear feet repaired
Homes and highway protected

Accomplishment: New parking Lower Tolt Levee Setback:

Engineered log jams

Tolt River

New levee and trail system

50 acres of floodplain reconnected

Accomplishment: Belmondo Revetment Enhancement

370 linear feet reconstructed
Improved habitat benefit
Protects SR 169, fiber optic cable and Cedar River Trail

Accomplishment: Rainbow Bend

Removed >900 linear feet levee
Reduces risk to infrastructure
Reconnects 40 acres floodplain

Accomplishment: Reddington Levee Setback



- 4800 linear feet
- 596 structures protected
- \$680 million assessed value

Accomplishment: White River Acquisitions

Acquired 18 properties / 17.4 acres
Relocated 6 houses from flood risk


