3	STATEMENT OF FACTS:	
4	1. King County has adopted	K.C.C. chapter 13.24, which requires
5	approval of comprehensive p	plans for water and sewer utilities that provide
6	service in unincorporated Ki	ng County as a prerequisite for operating in
7	unincorporated King County	, receiving approval for annexation proposals,
8	being granted right of way fi	ranchises, and being given approval for right
9	of way construction permits.	K.C.C. chapters 13.24 and 28.84 and chapter
10	57.16 RCW prescribe the red	quirements for approval of such plans,
11	including consistency with s	tate and local planning requirements.
12	2. The Coal Creek Utility D	istrict's last comprehensive plan was prepared
13	in 2005. Washington state I	Department of Ecology, Washington state
14	Department of Health and K	ing County regulations require water and
15	sewer system plans to be upo	lated every six years.
16	3. The district's service area	is within King County and the district has
17	adopted a comprehensive pla	n update ("the plan").
18	4. King County has adopted	a Comprehensive Plan that includes water

and wastewater policies in its provisions for facilities and services

20	(applicable portions of policies F-202 through F-264) that call for
21	consistency with other adopted plans, pursuit of reclaimed water, water
22	conservation and protection of water resources.
23	5. K.C.C. chapter 13.24 requires the utilities technical review committee
24	to review and make a recommendation to the King County executive and
25	council on the plan, the requirements under K.C.C. chapter 13.24 and
26	consistency with the King County Comprehensive Plan. The utilities
27	technical review committee has reviewed the planning data and district
28	operations and has found:
29	a. The plan uses population and employment forecasts developed by the
30	Puget Sound Regional Council and acknowledges the housing and job
31	growth targets adopted by the Growth Management Planning Council for
32	the district's service area;
33	b. A portion of the district's service area is in unincorporated King
34	County;
35	c. The capital facility plan is adequate to meet anticipated facility and
36	service needs;
37	d. The plan is consistent with applicable Washington state water quality
38	laws; and
39	e. The plan is consistent with other pertinent county adopted plans and
40	policies.

41	6. Washington state Department of Ecology and Washington state
42	Department of Health approval is pending upon King County's approval of
43	the plan.
44	7. Under the state Environmental Policy Act, the district issued a
45	Determination of Nonsignificance for the plan on September 11, 2013.
46	There were no appeals.
47	8. The district's operations and facilities meet multiple existing statutory,
48	administrative and planning standards. As the district's operations,
49	facilities and planning meet the requirements of the King County Code
50	and are consistent with the King County Comprehensive Plan, the utilities
51	technical review committee has recommended approval of the plan.
