	Proposed No. 2014-0270.1 Sponsors Dembowski and Dunn
1	AN ORDINANCE approving the Soos Creek Water &
2	Sewer District Water Comprehensive Plan.
3	STATEMENT OF FACTS:
4	1. King County has adopted K.C.C. chapter 13.24, which requires
5	approval of comprehensive plans for water and sewer utilities that provide
6	service in unincorporated King County as a prerequisite for operating in
7	unincorporated King County, receiving approval for annexation proposals,
8	being granted right of way franchises, and being given approval for right
9	of way construction permits. K.C.C. chapters 13.24 and 28.84 and chapter
10	57.16 RCW prescribe the requirements for approval of such plans,
11	including consistency with state and local planning requirements.
12	2. The district's last comprehensive plan was prepared in 2005.
13	Washington state Department of Health and King County regulations
14	require water plans to be updated every six years.
15	3. The district's service area is within King County and the district has
16	adopted a comprehensive plan update ("the plan").
17	4. King County has adopted a Comprehensive Plan that includes water
18	policies in its provisions for facilities and services (applicable portions of
19	policies F-101 through F-254) that call for consistency with other adopted

20	plans, pursuit of reclaimed water, water conservation and protection of
21	water resources.
22	5. K.C.C. chapter 13.24 requires the utilities technical review committee
23	to review and make a recommendation to the King County executive and
24	council on the plan, the requirements under K.C.C. chapter 13.24 and
25	consistency with the King County Comprehensive Plan. The utilities
26	technical review committee has reviewed the planning data and district
27	operations and has found:
28	a. The plan uses population and employment forecasts developed by the
29	Puget Sound Regional Council and acknowledges the housing and job
30	growth targets adopted by the Growth Management Planning Council for
31	the district's service area;
32	b. A portion of the district's service area is in unincorporated King
33	County;
34	c. The capital facility plan is adequate to meet anticipated facility and
35	service needs;
36	d. The plan is consistent with applicable Washington state water quality
37	laws; and
38	e. The plan is consistent with other pertinent county adopted plans and
39	policies.
40	6. Washington state Department of Health approval is pending upon King
41	County's approval of the plan.

42	7. Under the state Environmental Policy Act, the district issued a
43	Determination of Nonsignificance for the plan on May 22, 2012. There
44	were no appeals.
45	8. The district's operations and facilities meet multiple existing statutory,
46	administrative and planning standards. As the district's operations,
47	facilities and planning meet the requirements of the King County Code
48	and are consistent with the King County Comprehensive Plan, the utilities
49	technical review committee has recommended approval of the plan.
50	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:
51	SECTION 1. The Soos Creek Water & Sewer District Water Comprehensive

- 52 Plan, Attachment A to this ordinance, is hereby approved as a comprehensive water
- 53 system plan.
