Income Verification Requirements

What to bring to verify your income (see details from Metro):

If you already are enrolled in Washington Healthplanfinder, Apple Health, Washington Basic Food (EBT) or TANF, the enrollment expert can confirm your eligibility.

If you are in another defined benefits program, bring a letter or statement confirming that you're enrolled. Paystubs, tax returns and other documents can be used to verify your income. See details.

To qualify, a person's household income must be no more than 200 percent of the federal poverty level as established by the U.S. Health and Human Services Department as indicated in the chart below:
