- 14. Added \$276,000 to Community Service Operating for a contract for case managers, outreach workers and support staff to provide comprehensive advocacy to youth and their families throughout their contact with the juvenile justice system
- 1472 12. Made various changes in Community Services Operating.

1474 CAPITAL

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- Disappropriated \$2.2M in KCIT DJA Electronic Court Records Project CIP 1111942 and \$1.2M in KCIT DJA Electronic Court Records Project CIP 1111944 in Fund 3771 ORIM to transfer the appropriation to the DJA SCOMIS Replacement Project (DJACMS) CIP 1123900. This resulted in a \$7.4M project that would support a combined DJA Systems Replacement Project. Executive staff indicated that the two Electronic Court Records projects have significant overlap with the SCOMIS and that scope and budget can most efficiently be managed in a combined project.

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PROVISOS AND EXPENDITURE RESTRICTIONS INCLUDED IN THE SUBSTITUTE ORDINANCE:

Redefined proviso conditions to require a report that focuses on the current accreditation process for King County's emergency management program instead of a separate program self-assessment.

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2. Executive Services Administration, \$500,000

Released expenditure of \$500,000 to Executive Services – Administration.

The deleted proviso restricted \$500,000 in expenditures pending Council approval of an ordinance establishing the King County regional public safety answering point oversight committee. The executive transmitted Proposed Ordinance 2015-0255 as required, but Council passed Ordinance 18139 in place of the transmitted ordinance and allowed Proposed Ordinance 2015-0255 to lapse.

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3. Superior Court, \$125,000

Required the Court to submit a report on cost drivers as well as cost control strategies that are being employed to help control increasing interpreter expenses.

4. Community Services \$100,000

Fulfilled the Council's intention, as defined in Motion 14489, of making a near-term investment in targeted mentorship programs for youth.

5. Adult and Juvenile Detention \$100,000

Required the Executive to transmit two reports describing the results of the department of adult and juvenile detention's LEAN process on overtime and the plan for how the department will reduce the use of mandatory overtime.

6. Elections \$707,000

Included a \$356,000 Expenditure Restriction on limited English proficiency appropriation. It also included a \$50,000 proviso that requires Elections to transmit a plan for evaluating the effectiveness of translation and limited English proficiency outreach efforts and to explore cost containment strategies including collaborating with other county agencies and the community. In addition, included a \$351,000 proviso to be spent solely on drop boxes and prohibited the installation of the drop boxes until the drop box expansion plan in Motion 14491 is transmitted by the director of elections and is approved by Council.

King County Information Technology, Cloud E-Mail Pilot (Proviso and Expenditure Restriction) \$491,000

Restricted the appropriation for capital project (CIP 1127266) Cloud E-Mail Pilot such that no funds shall be expended or encumbered to transition more than two departments to cloud e-mail until the executive transmits a report on the results of the cloud e-mail pilot. The purpose of this proviso is to ensure that KCIT does not transition all county e-mail to Office 365 until KCIT has completed a report on the pilot e-mail project is doing for two projects.

8. E-911 Security Project

Restricted the appropriation for capital project (CIP 1127690) System Security such that \$3.5 million shall not be expended or encumbered until the executive hires an independent third-party quality assurance consultant with expertise in information technology security to conduct an assessment to ensure the following elements are being effectively and efficiently managed: scope; schedule; budget; and quality.

9. Children and Families Justice Center

Appropriated \$7.5 million of expected levy collections not previously appropriated. Restricted the appropriation to only be encumbered and expended (a) after the county has issued final acceptance to the design-builder of phase 1 to the children and family justice center; (b) to pay for capital improvement projects for juvenile justice and family law services that improve access to services intended to prevent youth involvement with the criminal justice system; and (c) only after the executive transmits a plan for the expenditure of levy proceeds remaining after issuing final acceptance. The plan shall be developed with input from the public and should consider recommendations
