1 STRIKING AMENDMENT TO PROPOSED ORDINANCE 2016-0005, VERSION

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- 3 On page 1, beginning on line 5, strike everything through page 5, line 74, and insert:
- 4 "STATEMENT OF FACTS:
- 5 1. The King County council adopted the King County Metro Strategic
- 6 Plan for Public Transportation 2011-2021 ("strategic plan") and the King
- 7 County Metro Service Guidelines ("service guidelines") in July 2011.
- 8 2. The regional transit task force recommended that the strategic plan and
- 9 service guidelines focus on transparency and clarity, cost control,
- productivity, social equity, geographic value and sustainable funding.
- 3. In 2010, the first-ever countywide King County Strategic Plan 2010-
- 12 2014 was adopted via Ordinance 16897, establishing prioritized goals,
- objectives and strategies for the programs and services of King County
- government. This countywide plan was also intended to provide a
- framework for all agency-level strategic planning, including planning for
- the transit division.

4. The strategic plan and service guidelines build on the King County
Strategic Plan 2010-2014 and the policy framework and recommendations
of the regional transit task force and are also guided by the challenges
King County Metro faces: population and economic growth, demographic
changes, funding, the environment, customer service and satisfaction,
access to transit, and an evolving transportation system.

- 5. The strategic plan and service guidelines are meant to be living documents setting the policy for and guiding the implementation of the Metro transit service network while responding to growth throughout the county, while also incorporating regular review of policies by the regional transit committee.
- 6. Ordinance 17143, Section 6, which adopted the strategic plan and service guidelines, directed the executive to transmit to the council an ordinance to update the strategic plan and service guidelines by April 30, 2012, 2013 and 2015, and as necessary thereafter for the purpose of validating policy intent of the strategic plan.
- 7. Ordinance 18029, Section 1, changed the due date for the April 30, 2015 update to December 15, 2015, to allow for the formation of a regional stakeholder task force called for in the 2015/2016 Biennial Budget Ordinance, Ordinance 17941, Section113, Proviso P1 to provide recommendations that influence the updates to the strategic plan and service guidelines.

| 39 | 8. In February 2015, the council passed Motion 14304, adopting the work |
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| 40 | plan for a regional stakeholder transit task force that convened from |
| 41 | March through October 2015. The task force made consensus |
| 42 | recommendations in October, 2015 after reviewing the following policy |
| 43 | areas identified in the charge: |
| 44 | a. How transit service performance is measured as specified in the |
| 45 | service guidelines to reflect the varied purposes of different types of |
| 46 | transit service; |
| 47 | b. Approaches to evaluating how the goal of geographic value is |
| 48 | included in the service guidelines, including minimum service standards; |
| 49 | c. Approaches to evaluating how the goal of social equity is included in |
| 50 | the service guidelines; |
| 51 | d. Financial policies for purchase of additional services within a |
| 52 | municipality or among multiple municipalities; and |
| 53 | e. Guidelines for alternative services implementation. |
| 54 | 9. In addition to changes recommended by the regional stakeholder task |
| 55 | force, the legislation and updates to the strategic plan and service |
| 56 | guidelines include: |
| 57 | a. Changes necessary to account for separately adopted transit policy |
| 58 | documents including updating the strategic plan and service guidelines; |
| 59 | b. Any proposed changes to address unanticipated issues associated with |
| 60 | implementing the strategic plan and service guidelines, including the |

61 factors that implement the concepts of productivity including land use, 62 social equity and geographic value; 63 c. Changes that may be necessary to achieve the five-year 64 implementation plan required in Ordinance 17143, Section 7; 65 d. Changes necessary to address the results of the collaborative process 66 required in Ordinance 17143, Section 8; and 67 e. Additional substantive changes proposed following regional transit 68 committee discussion. 69 10. In response to the regional transit task force recommendation to 70 consider alternative service products, the strategic plan for public 71 transportation establishes the goal of providing alternative services to 72 areas that are not well-served by fixed route service. The alternative transit 73 program was initiated through Ordinance 17143, Section 7, which directed 74 the establishment of a five-year implementation plan for alternatives to 75 traditional transit service delivery. Motion 13736 accepted the five-year 76 implementation plan and requested an annual report on alternative services 77 progress. Ordinance 17941, Section 113, as amended by Ordinance 18110, 78 Section 49, Proviso P8, established the 2015-2018 alternative services 79 demonstration program; and starting in 2014, the alternative services 80 annual report has been included in the annual service guidelines report 81 required by Ordinance 17143, Section 5, as amended by Ordinance 17597, 82 Section 1.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

- SECTION 1. The King County Metro Strategic Plan for Public Transportation
 2011-2021 is hereby updated as provided in Attachment A to this ordinance and the King
 County Metro Service Guidelines are hereby updated as provided in Attachment B to this
 ordinance.
- 88 <u>SECTION 2.</u> The following are each hereby repealed:
- A. Ordinance 17143, Section 3;
- 90 B. Ordinance 17386, Section 1;

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- 91 C. Ordinance 17641, Section 1; and
- D. Ordinance 17143, Section 4, as amended.
- 93 <u>SECTION 3.</u> A. The regional transit committee intends to monitor progress in the implementation of:
- The 2015-2018 alternative services demonstration program established by
 Ordinance 17941, Section 113, as amended by Ordinance 18110, Section 49, Proviso P8;
- 97 2. Strategic plan strategies 2.1.1, 2.1.4, 6.2.3 and 6.2.4; and
- 98 3. The Planning Alternative Services section of the service guidelines.
 - B. To allow the committee to more-effectively monitor progress in the implementation of alternative services and to consider possible future amendments to the strategic plan and service guidelines pertaining to prioritization criteria, performance measures and other aspects of the program, the transit division shall present updates to committee meetings at least quarterly and as requested by the chair and vice chair through approval of committee agendas. Each update shall include but not be limited to a discussion of the status of community engagement efforts, project implementation, and selected performance indicators; in addition:

- 1. The third quarter 2016 update shall include a summary of the findings of the alternative services demonstration program eighteen month report required by Ordinance 109 17941, Section 13, Proviso P5;
 - 2. The fourth quarter 2016 update shall be integrated with the annual service guidelines report chapter on alternative services and shall include a schedule and process for evaluating the prioritization criteria included in the 2015 service guidelines update to aid in prioritizing projects when the demand for alternative services exceeds the revenues necessary to fund said services;
 - 3. The 2017 quarterly updates shall include a discussion of the schedule and process for evaluating the alternative services prioritization criteria to allow for regional transit committee participation in the process; and
- 4. The fourth quarter 2017 update shall be integrated with the annual service guidelines report chapter on alternative services and shall include recommended options for prioritization criteria as directed by subsection b."

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- 127 The clerk may correct manifest errors in spelling and punctuation and clerical,
- typographical, formatting or numbering errors.

EFFECT: (1) Amends the Statement of Facts to correct numbering of section 9 and adds a new section 10 summarizing the legislative history of the alternative services program. (2) Adds a new ordinance section 2 repealing the current Transit Strategic Plan and current Service Guidelines, because these documents are entirely replaced by the 2015 Updates. (3) Adds new section 3 that provides for regular quarterly updates (briefings) to the RTC in 2016 and 2017 on the alternative services program so the RTC may consider possible future amendments to the Transit Strategic Plan and/or Service Guidelines relating to prioritization criteria and performance measures; the fourth quarter 2016 update is to include a schedule and process for evaluating prioritization criteria and is to be integrated with the annual service guidelines report for 2016; the fourth quarter 2017 update is to include Metro's recommended options for prioritization criteria and is to be integrated with the annual service guidelines report for 2017. Deletes transmitted Attachment A (Strategic Plan update 2015) and Attachment B (Service Guidelines update 2015) and replaces them with versions dated April 27, which contain the Committee-recommended changes. Attachment A changes include: (1) a revised performance measure of reduced fare permits and usage (page 7 and 56); (2) the description of "transit activity centers" (page 15); (3) list of other entities that Metro will work with to enhance Access to Transit (page 19); (4) Strategy 2.1.1 paragraph describing alternative services partnerships (page 29); (5) a revision to Strategy 2.1.4 identifying geographic coverage service gaps as one of the problems addressed by alternative services, and a clarifying edit to the text (page 30); (6) a revision to Strategy 3.2.4 identifying

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park-and-ride signage as a priority (page 36); (7) modifying Strategy 6.3.1 language concerning Metro's response when a grant or partnership funding for a bus route is ended (page 46). Attachment B changes include: (1) revision of the corridor productivity thresholds for clarity ("or" changed to "&") (page 7); (2) correction of description of hourly service to clarify the intended meaning of service every 60 minutes (page 11); (3) revised definition of Urban routes to clarify that they serve the densest of the PSRCdesignated Regional Growth Centers and correcting the names of centers ("Seattle Downtown," "First Hill/Capitol Hill," "the University Community") (page 14); (4) for Alternative Services, changes the term "allocation criteria" to "prioritization criteria" in four places (page 23); (5) clarifies Alternative Services community planning process identification of needs to include service agencies, jobs, education (page 24); (6) modifies "Working with Partners" section to require public outreach when there is partnership funding of bus service and revises the language explaining how partnership-funded service hours are added to the bus route network (pages 25-26); (7) adds unincorporated area outreach to the list of outreach strategies (page 27); (8) corrects names of regional growth centers and a transit activity center (pages 34-35, 41); and (9) deletes a duplicative entry in the list of transit corridors (page 37). Additional typographical errors are corrected and are listed in the Matrix. The clerk is authorized to correct manifest errors (these cannot change the substance of the document).

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
