1	AN ORDINANCE amending deadlines for the waste
2	export system plan, the metropolitan solid waste
3	management advisory committee, solid waste interlocal
4	forum and the interjurisdictional technical group; and
5	amending Ordinance 14971, Section 2, and K.C.C.
6	10.25.110 and Ordinance 14971, Section 6.

9	PREAMBLE:
10	The solid waste advisory committee and the metropolitan solid waste
11	management advisory committee have passed unanimous motions
12	recommending that four deliverable due dates be changed to allow them
13	additional time for review and comment. The interjurisdictional technical
14	staff group also agreed that the four deliverable due dates be changed.
15	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:
<b>T</b> 6	SECTION 1. Ordinance 14971, Section2; and K.C.C. 10.25.110 are hereby

A. A metropolitan solid waste management advisory committee is established. Each component city with a signed interlocal agreement participating in the county solid waste management system shall identify representatives and alternates to the solid waste division for appointment to the advisory committee. The committee shall conduct its first meeting on or after January 2, 2005. The solid waste division shall notify each component city with a signed interlocal agreement participating in the county solid waste management system of committee meeting times and locations. At the first meeting, the committee shall elect a chair. The members of the committee shall serve at the pleasure of the appointing bodies and shall receive no compensation from King County other than reimbursement for reasonable expenses actually incurred in the performance of their duties.

B. The metropolitan solid waste management advisory committee shall advise the executive, the solid waste interlocal forum established in the solid waste service contracts between the county and cities, and the King County council in all matters relating to solid waste management and participate in the development of the solid waste management system and waste export system plan.

C. The metropolitan solid waste management advisory committee shall review and make recommendations on the waste export system plan before transmittal of the plan form the King County executive to the King County council.

D.1. Until the metropolitan solid waste management advisory committee first convenes, and interjurisdictional technical staff group presently assembled shall serve in lieu of the metropolitan solid waste management advisory committee. The interjurisdictional technical staff group shall advise the metropolitan solid waste

42	the committee during its ((first year of)) preliminary work. Each city with a solid waste
43	interlocal agreement with King County may participate in the interjurisdictional technical
44	staff group. The group shall provide a report of its findings and recommendations by
45	December 31, 2004, to all cities participating in the county solid waste management
46	system, the King County executive, the King County council, the solid waste advisory
47	committee and the solid waste interlocal forum, or its successor, on the structure, function
48	and responsibilities of the metropolitan solid waste management advisory committee.
49	The staff group shall provide a report of its findings and recommendations by
50	((December 31, 2005)) April 30, 2006, to all cities participating in the county solid waste
51	management system, the metropolitan solid waste management advisory committee, the
52	King County executive, King County council, the solid waste advisory committee and the
53	solid waste interlocal forum, or its successor.
54	2. The interjurisdictional technical staff group report shall address at least the
55	following issues:
56	a. potential modification or replacement of the solid waste interlocal forum, to
57	identify membership, decision-making responsibilities and scope of duties;
58	b. identification of dispute resolution options;
59	c. development of a framework for financial policies and host city mitigation,
60	including compensation agreements;
61	d. evaluation of the impact of the proposed waste export system plan on each
62	of the provisions of the solid waste interlocal agreement between King County and cities:

64	e. identification of potential amendments to the solid waste interlocal

66	3. The solid waste interlocal forum, or its successor, shall make a
67	recommendation to the King County executive and King County council on or before
68	((December 31, 2005)) April 30, 2006, on the efficacy of the continuing role of the
69	interjurisdictional technical staff group.
70	E. The solid waste division shall provide staff support to the metropolitan solid
71	waste management advisory committee and the interjurisdictional technical staff group.
72	The King County council shall provide staff support fin the development of solid waste
73	planning legislation.
74	SECTION 2. Ordinance 14971, Section 6; is hereby amended to read as follows:
75	Reporting.
76	A. The solid waste division shall submit a waste export system plan to the
77	council and solid waste interlocal forum or its successor by ((December 31, 2005)) April
78	30, 2006. The division shall also regularly report back to the council and solid waste
79	interlocal forum, or its successor, throughout the system plan development process.
30	B. Major milestones for reports to be submitted by the solid waste division to the
31	council and solid waste interlocal forum, or its successor, for review and council approval
32	by motion shall include, but not be limited to:
33	1. Transfer system level of service standards and criteria;
34	2. Analysis of system needs and capacity;
