1	AN ORDINANCE relating to the levy collection of the
2	sales and use tax of one-tenth of one percent for the
3	delivery of mental health and chemical dependency
4	services, and therapeutic courts; continuing the sales and
5	use tax by revising the expiration date of Ordinance 15949,
6	as amended; and amending Ordinance 15949, Section 9.
7	PREAMBLE:
8	In 2005, recognizing the need for additional mental health and chemical
9	dependency programs, the state legislature authorized counties to
10	implement a one-tenth of one percent sales and use tax to support new
11	programs.
12	The one-tenth of one percent sales and use tax supporting new or
13	expanded chemical dependency or mental health treatment programs and
14	services and for the operation of new or expanded therapeutic court
15	programs and services, known as the mental illness and drug dependency
16	("MIDD") sales and use tax, generates between fifty and sixty-five million
17	dollars annually for King County.

20	expire January 1, 2017. As provided under Ordinance 15949, the county
21	chooses to amend the expiration date to provide for continued collection of
22	the sales and use tax.
23	King County's MIDD is a comprehensive approach to creating
24	improvements across the continuum of the behavioral health system and
25	making progress toward public policy goals such as reduced jail and
26	emergency department use, reduced psychiatric hospitalizations, and
27	reductions in incidence and severity of chemical dependency and mental
28	and emotional disorders in youth and adults. Aggregated MIDD
29	evaluation data finds that MIDD supported programs are successful and
30	effective in meeting the policy goals established by Ordinance 15949 and
31	warrants a continuation of the sale and use tax.
32	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:
33	SECTION 1. Findings: Continuing the mental illness and drug dependency
34	sales and use tax of one-tenth of one percent authorized by RCW 82.14.460 and by
35	Ordinance 15949 enables the county to maintain and build upon the successes of mental
36	illness and drug dependency sales and use tax supported programs and services to:
37	promote adequate, stable public funding for community behavioral health services in
38	King County; ensure timely, affordable and culturally-appropriate access to behavioral
39	health services that focus on recovery and resilience; improve community-based services
40	and programs; and better meet the behavioral needs of people in need of services, thereby
41	reducing costly incarceration and emergency room utilization.
