1	AN ORDINANCE approving the Highline Water District
2	Water System Plan, Final August 2016.
3	STATEMENT OF FACTS:
4	1. King County has adopted K.C.C. chapter 13.24, which requires
5	approval of comprehensive plans for water and sewer utilities that provide
6	service in unincorporated King County as a prerequisite for operating in
7	unincorporated King County, receiving approval for annexation proposals,
8	being granted right-of-way franchises and being given approval for right-
9	of-way construction permits. K.C.C. chapter 13.24 prescribes the
10	requirements for approval of those plans, including consistency with state
11	and local planning requirements.
12	2. RCW 57.16.010 requires that general comprehensive plans by special
13	purpose districts be submitted to, and approved by, the legislative
14	authority within whose boundaries all or a portion of a utility lies.
15	3. Highline Water District's last general water facility plan was approved
16	in 2009. Washington state Department of Health and King County
17	regulations require water system plans to be updated every six years.
18	4. The district has a service area within King County and has adopted a
19	water system plan update ("the plan").

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20	5. King County has adopted a Comprehensive Plan that includes policies
21	F-101 through F-254, the applicable portions of which address water
22	policies for facilities and services; these water policies call for consistency
23	with other adopted plans, pursuit of reclaimed water, water conservation
24	and protection of water resources.
25	6. K.C.C. chapter 13.24 requires the utilities technical review committee
26	to review and make a recommendation to the King County executive and
27	council on the plan, the requirements under K.C.C. chapter 13.24 and
28	consistency with the King County Comprehensive Plan. The utilities
29	technical review committee has reviewed the planning data and system
30	operations and has found:
31	a. The plan uses population and employment forecasts developed by the
32	Puget Sound Regional Council;
33	b. The district's service area is within King County;
34	c. The capital facility plan is adequate to meet anticipated facility and
35	service needs;
36	d. The plan is consistent with applicable Washington state water quality
37	laws; and
38	e. The plan is consistent with other pertinent county adopted plans and
39	policies.
40	7. Washington state Department of Health approval is pending upon King
41	County's approval of the plan.

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42	8. Under the state Environmental Policy Act the district completed an
43	environmental check list and the district issued a determination of
44	nonsignificance for the plan approval on March 9, 2016. There were no
45	appeals.
46	9. The district's operations and facilities meet multiple existing statutory,
47	administrative and planning standards. As the district's operations,
48	facilities and planning meet the requirements of the King County Code
49	and are consistent with the King County Comprehensive Plan, the utilities
50	technical review committee has recommended approval of the plan.
51	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

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SECTION 1. The Highline Water District Water System Plan, Final August
2016, Attachment A to this ordinance, is hereby approved as a comprehensive water
system plan.
