1	AN ORDINANCE relating to the purchase of renewable	
2	electricity; authorizing the executive to enter into a long-	
3	term agreement for the purchase of renewable, greenhouse	
4	gas neutral electricity from Puget Sound Energy.	
5	STATEMENT OF FACTS:	
6	1. Climate change is one of the paramount challenges of our generation.	
7	King County is already experiencing the impacts of a changing climate:	
8	warming temperatures, acidifying marine waters, rising seas, increasing	
9	flooding risk, decreasing mountain snowpack and less water in the	
10	summer. Climate change will have long-term consequences for the	
11	economy, the environment, and public health and safety in King County.	
12	2. King County has a long record of innovation, leadership and	
13	investment in reducing greenhouse gas emissions and preparing for the	
14	impacts of climate change. Consideration of climate change impacts and	
15	opportunities to reduce energy use and greenhouse gas emissions are	
16	deeply embedded throughout the work plans and capital investments of	
17	county departments and lines of business.	
18	3. Since 2007, investments in energy efficiency and changes in operations	
19	have reduced normalized energy use in existing buildings and facilities by	

20	more than twenty percent, generating over three million dollars in annual
21	savings.
22	4. King County is now producing renewable energy equivalent to more
23	than one hundred percent of total operational energy use, excluding public
24	transit vehicles.
25	5. The 2015 King County Strategic Climate Action Plan maps specific
26	pathways and actions needed to achieve the ambitious countywide climate
27	goals of reducing greenhouse gas emissions by eighty percent by 2050
28	against a 2007 baseline with interim goals of twenty-five-percent
29	reduction by 2020 and fifty-percent reduction by 2030.
30	6. The Strategic Climate Action Plan establishes goals, targets, measures
31	and priority actions in five goal areas for reducing greenhouse gas
32	emissions: (a) transportation and land use; (b) building and facilities
33	energy; (c) green building; (d) consumption and materials management;
34	and (e) forestry and agriculture.
35	7. While the county surpassed its energy efficiency goal for 2015 and is
36	pursuing additional energy reductions by 2020, reducing greenhouse gas
37	emissions associated with energy supplies through increased consumption
38	of renewable energy and reduced reliance on fossil fuels continues to be
39	an essential strategy for meeting the county's operational and countywide
40	climate goals.
41	8. The Strategic Climate Action Plan calls for increasing the percentage
42	of energy from renewable sources used in county operations, setting a

43	target of consuming renewable energy equal to seventy percent of energy
44	consumed in county operations by 2020 and eighty-five percent by 2025.
45	The plan also calls for all electricity supplied for King County's
46	government operations to be greenhouse gas neutral by 2025. The plan
47	sets a countywide target of increasing renewable electricity supply to
48	ninety percent of delivered electricity by 2030.
49	9. Ordinance 17971 requires the wastewater treatment division and solid
50	waste division to be carbon neutral by 2025. The emissions related to
51	electricity provided by Puget Sound Energy is the largest source of
52	greenhouse gas emissions for the wastewater treatment division and the
53	second largest source for the solid waste division.
54	10. The Strategic Climate Action Plan recommends that the county
55	partner with utilities and others to phase out coal-fired electricity by 2025
56	and support development of increasing amounts of renewable energy
57	resources.
58	11. Within Puget Sound Energy's electricity service area, approximately
59	fifty-nine percent of electricity supply is supplied by carbon-based
60	sources, including thirty-five percent coal and twenty-four percent natural
61	gas.
62	12. As of 2014, sixty-four percent of the county's electricity supply came
63	from renewable sources, compared to the goal of ninety percent by 2030
64	in the Strategic Climate Action Plan.

65	13. King County is a major electricity customer of Puget Sound Energy,
66	purchasing more than ten million dollars a year in electricity to operate
67	county buildings and facilities within Puget Sound Energy's electricity
68	service territory.
69	14. Puget Sound Energy has been a strong partner in helping King County
70	achieve energy efficiency goals through energy conservation rebates and
71	incentives.
72	15. Washington state regulations limit the ability of customers like King
73	County to directly purchase renewable energy from non-utility suppliers.
74	16. King County and cities in King County have requested that Puget
75	Sound Energy expand options for the purchase of renewable energy for
76	customers within its service territory.
77	17. Puget Sound Energy developed and received approval from the
78	Washington state Utilities and Transportation Commission in September
79	2016 for Tariff Schedule No. 139 Voluntary Long Term Renewable
80	Energy, known as Green Direct, offering renewable electricity from a
81	Washington wind facility that will be operational on January 1, 2019.
82	18. Green Direct is available to municipal and large commercial
83	electricity users.
84	19. Qualified customers can contract to purchase renewable electricity
85	available beginning in 2019 for a term of ten, fifteen, or twenty years
86	under the service agreement approved as part of Schedule 139 and
87	provided as Attachment A to this ordinance.

88	20. The service agreement calculates the net cost of Green Direct
89	electricity to be the price of the renewable electricity charge in Schedule
90	139, which consists of an initial fixed rate that will increase two percent
91	annually over the term, less a credit for the cost of conventional electricity,
92	plus ongoing and standard charges for transmission, distribution, billing
93	and other regular services.
94	21. According to the Seventh Power Plan issued by the Northwest Power
95	and Conversation Council in February 2016, standard electricity prices are
96	forecast to increase by three percent annually from years 2019 to 2028.
97	22. The service agreement requires King County to identify facilities and
98	quantify its anticipated electrical use for enrollment in the Green Direct
99	program, in order to match customer demand with projected electricity
100	supply from the new wind facility.
101	23. The service agreement allows King County to exit the Green Direct
102	program before the service agreement term ends, but requires payment of

110	Energy with a high certainty of operation through the ten-year term of the
111	agreement.
112	25. King County expressed interest in enrollment during the first open
113	season for Green Direct, which closed on November 18, 2016. Execution
114	of a binding service agreement is needed to secure power on a first-come,
115	first-served basis through the Green Direct option beginning in 2019.
116	26. King County will remain a full-service Puget Sound Energy customer,
117	and will continue to partner with Puget Sound Energy on conservation and
118	outreach efforts.
119	27. The actual electrons generated from the wind facility may not directly
120	supply King County operations, but will flow to the electrical grid. King
121	County will receive equivalent renewable electricity under the service
122	agreement.
123	28. Renewable Energy Certificates associated with this wind energy
124	resource will be retired, ensuring that King County's electricity purchase is
125	supporting development of additional renewable energy supply and that
126	associated reductions in greenhouse gas emissions can be counted in King
127	County's greenhouse gas emissions inventory. The retirement of the
128	Renewable Energy Certificates will be verified by the Western Renewable
129	Energy Generation Information System, an independent tracking system.
130	29. Purchasing renewable electricity through Green Direct is projected to
131	reduce direct greenhouse emissions for King County operations by
132	approximately twenty percent.

133	30. Purchasing power through Green Direct advances Strategic Climate
134	Action Plan policy goals and commitments to reduce greenhouse gas
135	emissions from county operations, increase the use of renewable energy,
136	source greenhouse gas neutral electricity, and use county energy
137	investments to catalyze development of our state's clean energy economy.
138	31. The county has evaluated the cost of Green Direct electricity
139	compared to projected costs of conventional electricity over the term of
140	the agreement using three scenarios based on historic average annual price
141	increases for electricity purchased from Puget Sound Energy and one
142	scenario using projected average annual increases in electricity prices in
143	the Seventh Regional Power Plan. Based on this assessment, the county
144	finds that the risk of higher incremental cost over the term of the
145	agreement is minimal and is offset by the benefits of certain pricing for
146	electricity supply and substantial, cost-effective progress in achieving the
147	county's commitments in the Strategic Climate Action Plan.
148	32. The county will continue to work in partnership with utilities, cities
149	and businesses to seek further energy conservation and clean, renewable
150	energy supplies for all Puget Sound Energy customers.
151	33. The term of this agreement, through 2028, extends beyond current
152	budget appropriation authorized by the King County council.
153	BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:
154	SECTION 1. The King County council has determined that the purchase of
155	renewable electricity under the Green Direct program offered by Puget Sound Energy for

156	a ten-year term advances the county's renewable energy and greenhouse gas emission
157	reduction goals adopted as part of King County's 2015 Strategic Climate Action Plan.
158	SECTION 2. The King County executive is hereby authorized to execute the
159	service agreement for the purchase of renewable electricity with Puget Sound Energy
160	substantially in the form of Attachment A to this ordinance for a term of ten years

## VOLUNTARY LONG TERM RENEWABLE ENERGY SERVICE AGREEMENT

#### Attachment "A" - Service Agreement

THIS SCHEDULE 139 VOLUNTARY LONG TERM RENEWABLE ENERGY SERVICE AGREEMENT ("Service Agreement"), dated as of the \_\_\_\_\_\_, is made and entered into by and between **King County** (the "Customer") and PUGET SOUND ENERGY, a Washington Corporation, (the "Company"), for service under the Company's Electric Tariff G Schedule 139. Terms defined in Schedule 139 and in the General Rules and Provisions (Schedule 80) of the Company's tariff for electric service shall have the same meanings where used in this Agreement.

#### RECITALS

- A. The Company is a public service company engaged in the sale and delivery of electric energy pursuant to its Electric Tariff G.
- B. Customer is receiving Electric Service under the Company's Electric Tariff G, Schedule 24, 25, 26, 31, 40, 43, 46 or 49, and desires to participate in the Company's Voluntary Long Term
  Renewable Energy program offered under Schedule 139.
- C. The Company and the Customer have worked jointly to encourage the development of Renewable Energy projects that (i) could provide clean energy to customers at a long-term contracted rate, (ii) support the local economy, and (iii) could be publicized and leveraged for external benefit. The Parties agree that the <u>Wind 10 Year</u> (the "Resource Option") should meet these criteria, and the Parties thus now agree to enter into this Service Agreement with each other, for mutual benefit.
- D. The Company will sell and the Customer will purchase from the Company Renewable Energy Credits (RECs), where applicable, and Renewable Energy at a contracted volume equal to 100% of the load of all meters located at each subscribed service address (the sum of Anticipated Average Annual Loads) as listed in Section 5, with such amount to be allocated from Renewable Energy generated by the Resource Option, pursuant to one of the contracted rates described.

#### AGREEMENT

- 1. **Request and Acknowledgement.** The Customer requests service under Schedule 139 and acknowledges that Schedule 139 requires a minimum term. Service under Schedule 139 will be billed on the Customer's existing statement. The Resource Option Energy Charge is fixed as shown in Section 7. The Energy Charge Credit will be updated with each general rate case, power cost only rate case or other power-related filings.
- 2. **Resource.** Under this Service Agreement the Company will receive Renewable Energy into its Balancing Authority Area from where it can serve the Customer.
- 3. **Renewable Energy Credits.** The Company will acquire the RECs that are created with the electricity production, where applicable. The Company will transfer the RECs to the Customer

which must be retired in WREGIS. Alternatively, at the Customer's request, the Company will retire the RECs in WREGIS. As the Customer is receiving a retail product, the RECs may not be resold or transferred to another party.

- 4. **Resource Option.** Number: 13901W10 Description: Large wind project in Thurston and Lewis Counties, Washington
- 5. Customer Service Address and Account Numbers. The Customer requests service under this Service Agreement for the service addresses, account numbers and meter numbers listed in Attachment B. The aggregated Anticipated Average Annual Load is included in Attachment B.
- 6. Term. The term of this Service Agreement shall commence in the year 2019, on the first day of the Customer's normal billing cycle, in the first month following the commencement of commercial operation of the Resource Option, and delivery therefrom of energy to the Company sufficient to satisfy the obligations set forth in this Service Agreement. This Service Agreement terminates in the year 2028 after 12 billing cycles.
- 7. Rates. Schedule 139 rates are in addition to all charges under the Customer's existing Electric Service schedule. Rates include a charge per kWh for the contracted energy as outlined in Table 1 and a credit for the energy-related power cost component of the Energy Charge set forth in Schedule 24, 25, 26, 31, 40, 43, 46 or 49 of the Electric Tariff WN U-60 under which the Customer is taking Electric Service. The Energy Charge Credit will be updated with each general rate case, power cost only rate case, or other power-related filings, while the Resource Option Energy Charge will remain fixed as outlined in the Table 1. below.

8. Early Exit Fee. Customers may elect to terminate this Service Agreement prior to the Termination Date with 60 days' notice to the Company. Customers who choose to discontinue their service under this Schedule will be charged for the net cost of the remaining Renewable Energy that was to be delivered to the Customer under the remaining term of the Service Agreement. This amount will be based on: 1) the remaining term of the Service Agreement, 2) the amount of annual Renewable Energy needs ("full requirements") of each of the discontinued Customer' locations as listed in Section 5 of the Service Agreement, 3) the contracted energy rates agreed to in Section 7 of the Service Agreement, and 4) a credit for PSE's then-current

avoided costs (filed consistent with WAC 480-107-055). Termination of service under this Schedule will follow receipt and processing of the termination request by the Company.

- 9. Resource Option Inadequacy. If the Resource Option will not be available at the start of the commencement year, the Customer's agreement will be delayed to align with the Resource Option. If the Renewable Energy produced by the Resource Option and purchased by the Company is insufficient in any calendar year to satisfy the full requirements of the Customer, the Company will work with the Customer to source and retire for the Customer RECs from alternative resources, with costs for the RECs limited to the net amount to be collected under Schedule 139 from the Customer for the remainder of the calendar year. If, at the Company's determination, the Resource Option will not be adequate to meet the full requirements of the Customer, then this Service Agreement will be terminated with no liability to the Customer or to the Company. If a replacement project can be sourced and mutually agreed upon, a new Service Agreement will be created.
- 10. **Credit**. Customer authorizes that the Company may run a credit report on Customer and/or request audited financial statements for the purpose of determining the Customer's creditworthiness for this service.
- 11. **Energy Efficiency Services**. The Customer and the Company will continue to partner on mutually beneficial energy efficiency projects which will reduce energy demand on an annual basis. These services will have no bearing on the cost of energy as proposed in Table 1.
- 12. **Electrical Work**. In order to ensure continued qualification for service under Schedule 139, the Customer must contact the Company through their business account services representative when any electrical work is being conducted.
- 13. **Governing Law**. This Service Agreement will be governed by and interpreted, construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Washington.
