and von Reichbauer 1 A MOTION directing legislative department staff to 2 prepare a report, in consultation with all councilmembers and the executive branch that provides strategies for how 3 4 King County can engage stakeholders in a public process to 5 determine how to use proceeds from Sound Transit 3 in the Puget Sound taxpayer accountability account. 6 7 WHEREAS, the Washington state Legislature amended chapter 81.112 RCW via 8 Second Engrossed Substitute Senate Bill 5987 in 2015 to create the Puget Sound taxpayer accountability account, and 9 10 WHEREAS, the Puget Sound taxpayer accountability account is to be funded by a sales and use tax offset fee of three and twenty-five one-hundredths percent of the total 11 12 payments made by a regional transit authority to construction contractors on construction 13 projects that are: (a) for new projects identified in the system plan funded by any proposition approved by voters after January 1, 2015; and (b) excluded from the 14 15 definition of retail sales under RCW 82.04.050(10), and WHEREAS, on June 23, 2016, the Sound Transit board adopted the Sound 16 Transit 3 ballot measure and placed it on the November 1, 2016, election, and 17 18 WHEREAS, voters in the Sound Transit regional transit authority, which includes parts of King, Pierce and Snohomish counties, approved the ballot measure by a margin 19

20	of fifty-four percent to forty-six percent, and	
21	WHEREAS, between 2018 and 2035, King County is currently projected to	
22	receive approximately three hundred forty-five million dollars, and	
23	WHEREAS, the proceeds are required to be used for a broad array of educationa	
24	services to educational outcomes in early learning, K-12 and higher education, including	
25	but not limited to, for youths who are low-income, homeless, in foster care or other	
26	vulnerable populations, and	
27	WHEREAS, to the greatest extent practicable, the expenditures of the county	
28	must follow the requirements of the Sound Transit subarea equity policy, and	
29	WHEREAS, the proceeds may only be spent after the Washington state	
30	Legislature appropriates them;	
31	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:	
32	A. Legislative department staff are directed to prepare a report that describes:	
33	1. The intent of the state Legislature in adopting Second Engrossed Substitute	
34	Senate Bill 5987 to include a review of legislative history and, if necessary to clarify	
35	intent, based on consultation with elected legislators and staff;	
36	2. Allowable uses for the King County portion of the proceeds; and	
37	3. Strategies for how King County can identify unmet needs and how the funds	
38	can be used to meet those needs, including approaches to engage stakeholders and the	
39	public in this analysis.	
40	B. In preparing the report, legislative department staff shall consult with and	
41	include input from councilmembers and the executive branch, including documenting	
42	work completed and public input received by executive staff.	

43	C. The report shall be delivered no later than October 1, 2017.		
44	D. The report shall be filed in the form of ten original copies and an electronic		
45	copy with the clerk of the council who will retain an original and provide a copy to all		
46	councilmembers and the lead staff to the committee of the whole or its successor.
