1	AN ORDINANCE relating to the solid waste division's
2	2017-2018 Biennial Budget; amending the 2017-2018
3	Biennial Budget Ordinance, Ordinance 18409, Sections 107
4	and 107, as amended.
5	STATEMENT OF FACTS:
6	1. The solid waste division of the department of natural resources and
7	parks operates the Cedar Hills regional landfill, eight transfer stations and
8	two drop boxes. It also provides innovative programs to help customers
9	recycle and prevent waste.
10	2. The 2006 Transfer and Waste Management Plan ("the 2006 transfer
11	plan"), approved in 2007 by Ordinance 15979, recommended a new
12	Northeast recycling and transfer station ("Northeast station") to meet
13	growing demand for solid waste services in northeast King County.
14	3. The 2006 transfer plan also recommended that the aging Houghton
15	transfer station be closed when replacement capacity is available.
16	4. To confirm the need for new stations including a Northeast station, two
17	reviews of the 2006 transfer plan were directed through the 2013/2014
18	Biennial Budget Ordinance, Ordinance 17696, Section 25, Proviso P1, and
19	Motion 14145 passed in 2014.

20	5. While the need for a new station was under review, Ordinance 17696
21	adopted in 2013 removed the Northeast station project from the division's
22	capital improvement program.
23	6. The second transfer plan review, completed in 2015, suggested that if
24	the cities of Bellevue, Clyde Hill, Hunts Point, Medina and Yarrow Point
25	leave the regional system in 2028 per existing interlocal agreements,
26	demand management actions such as extending station hours and charging
27	peak-hour prices could meet customer needs for many years without a
28	Northeast station.
29	7. In 2015 the county auditor confirmed the conclusions from the second
30	transfer plan review and recommended real-world testing to confirm that
31	modeled demand management actions perform as predicted.
32	8. To confirm the potential effectiveness of demand management,
33	Ordinance 18409 approved 2017-2018 appropriations to conduct a
34	northeast-area demand management pilot program. Ordinance 18409 also
35	included the sale of the division's Eastgate property.
36	9. Motion 14856 acknowledged receipt of a demand management pilot
37	program implementation plan that recommended the temporary
38	suspension of commercial and self-haul garbage services at the Houghton
39	transfer station, as well as extended hours and peak-hour pricing at the
40	Factoria transfer and recycling station. Additional approval by ordinance
41	to authorize a temporary suspension of service at the Houghton recycling
42	and transfer station and to establish peak pricing at the Factoria recycling

43		and transfer station would have been required in order to implement the
44		pilot program.
45		10. A July 2017 letter co-signed by the county executive and Bellevue
46		city manager outlined a process by which the city of Bellevue would
47		extend its solid waste interlocal agreement through 2040 subject to the
48		county's cancelation of the 2018-2019 demand management pilot program,
49		commitment to a Northeast station and agreement that the county-owned
50		Eastgate property would not be used to expand the Factoria transfer and
51		recycling station instead of siting a Northeast station.
52		11. If Bellevue extends its interlocal agreement and the Houghton
53		recycling and transfer station is closed in accordance with the 2006
54		transfer plan, the executive's assessment is that the county's transfer
55		system would exceed level-of-service standards without a Northeast
56		station and also that demand management at the Factoria recycling and
57		transfer station is no longer a substitute for a Northeast station.
58		12. Construction of a Northeast recycling and transfer station in the future
59		would be subject to the county's debt management policies, which
60		currently are set forth in Motion 12660, including the policies in section
61		6.2 of Attachment A to Motion 12660 relating to the term of financing.
62		BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:
63		SECTION 1. Ordinance 18409, Section 107, as amended, is hereby amended to
64	read a	as follows:
65		SOLID WASTE - From the solid waste fund there is hereby disappropriated from:

66	Solid waste (\$5,036,000)
67	SECTION 2. The council directs that section 1 of this ordinance takes effect
68	before section 3 of this ordinance.
69	SECTION 3. Ordinance 18409, Section 107, as amended and as amended by
70	section 1 of this ordinance, is hereby amended to read as follows:
71	SOLID WASTE - From the solid waste fund there is hereby appropriated to:
72	Solid waste \$4,000,000
73	The maximum number of additional FTEs for solid waste shall be: 1.0
74	ER1 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:
75	Of this appropriation, \$10,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to increase
76	the amount of the contract with Friends of the Trail. The additional contract amount
77	should be used to support expanded trail cleanup activities, including but not limited to
78	cleanup of infectious waste.
79	ER 2 EXPENDITURE RESTRICTION:
80	Of this appropriation, \$1,000,000 shall be expended or encumbered solely to
81	conduct planning work to assess waste transfer capacity needs in the Northeast area of
82	King County and options to meet those needs.
83	P1 PROVIDED THAT:
84	Of this appropriation, \$1,000,000 shall not be expended or encumbered until the
85	executive transmits the Solid Waste Comprehensive Plan, and a motion that should
86	acknowledge receipt of the plan and reference the subject matter, the proviso's ordinance,
87	ordinance section and proviso number in both the title and body of the motion and a
88	motion acknowledging receipt of the plan is passed by the council.

89	\underline{A} . In light of the current forecasted waste generation for the region and the
90	diminishing capacity at the Cedar Hills landfill as it is currently configured, the plan shall
91	include, but not be limited to, a range of strategies to address the disposal of the region's
92	waste, including alternatives to landfilling, and an analysis of the costs and benefits of the
93	respective strategies.
94	B. The plan must also address current waste transfer capacity needs in the
95	Northeast area of King County and how those needs are proposed to be met.
96	The executive must file the plan and the motion required by this proviso by March
97	31, 2018, in the form of a paper original and an electronic copy with the clerk of the
98	council, who shall retain the original and provide an electronic copy to all
99	councilmembers, the council chief of staff and the lead staff for the transportation,
100	economy and environment committee, or its successor. If the plan and motion are not
101	transmitted by that date, appropriation authority for the \$1,000,000 restricted by this
102	proviso will lapse.
103	P2 PROVIDED FURTHER THAT:
104	Of this appropriation, \$2,462,500 shall not be expended or encumbered until the
105	executive transmits two reports: the first on solid waste system tonnage and the second on
106	expansion of the Cedar Hills regional landfill, and motions that should acknowledge
107	receipt of the reports and reference the subject matter, the proviso's ordinance, ordinance
108	section and proviso number in both the title and body of the motions and motions
109	acknowledging receipt of the reports are passed by the council.
110	A. The first report shall include, but not be limited to:
111	1. Projected tonnage of waste received for 2017, including a description of the

112	factors influencing the 2017 tonnage projections;
113	2. A discussion of any landfill capacity changes resulting from the 2017
114	projections;
115	3. Any tonnage-driven system operational impacts; and
116	4. Any potential revenue increases or decreases associated with the 2017
117	tonnage projections.
118	B. The second report shall include, but not be limited to:
119	1. The actual tonnage received for 2017;
120	2. A comparison of the costs to expand the capacity of the Cedar Hills regional
121	landfill, with the cost of waste export;
122	3. A projected date of closure for the Cedar Hills regional landfill, in the
123	absence of the expansion of the landfill; and
124	4. Recommendations for extending the life of the Cedar Hills regional landfill.
125	The executive should file the first report and motion required by this proviso by
126	December 1, 2017, and the second report and a motion required by this proviso by June
127	1, 2018, in the form of a paper original and an electronic copy with the clerk of the
128	council, who shall retain the original and provide an electronic copy to all
129	councilmembers, the council chief of staff and the lead staff for the transportation,
130	economy and environment committee, or its successor.
131	P3 PROVIDED FURTHER THAT:
132	Of this appropriation, \$1,000,000 shall not be expended or encumbered until the
133	executive transmits a plan to implement the demand management pilot program, as
134	identified in Attachment A to Ordinance 18377, starting on page 11, and a motion that

135	should acknowledge receipt of the plan and reference the subject matter, the proviso's
136	ordinance, ordinance section and proviso number in both the title and body of the motion
137	and a motion acknowledging receipt of the plan is passed by the council.
138	The plan shall include, but is not limited to:
139	A. A description of all the elements needed to implement the pilot program;
140	B. The evaluation of the use of the Houghton transfer station during the pilot
141	program, as contemplated on page 12 in the Attachment A to Ordinance 18377. In
142	completing this evaluation, the executive should consider whether during the pilot
143	program to:
144	1. Temporarily suspend operations at the Houghton transfer station or
145	temporarily curtail its hours of operation;
146	2. Temporarily increase the rates charged to customers at the Houghton transfer
147	station to discourage customers' use of it; and
148	3. Temporarily change the types of waste management services offered at the
149	Houghton transfer station;
150	C. A recommendation of how the Houghton transfer station should be used
151	during the pilot program; and
152	D. A description of how the results of the pilot program will be addressed in the
153	Solid Waste Comprehensive Plan without delaying the implementation of the Solid
154	Waste Comprehensive Plan.
155	The executive should file the plan and the motion required by this proviso by
156	March 30, 2017, in the form of a paper original and an electronic copy with the clerk of
157	the council, who shall retain the original and provide an electronic copy to all

158 councilmembers, the council chief of staff and the lead staff for the transportation,

159 economy and environment committee or its successor.

160 P4 PROVIDED FURTHER THAT:

161 Of this appropriation, \$1,000,000 shall not be expended or encumbered until the

162 executive transmits an implementation report on the demand management pilot program,

as identified in Ordinance 18377, Attachment A, starting on page 11, and a motion

acknowledging receipt of the report and referencing the subject matter, the proviso's

165 ordinance, ordinance section and proviso number in both the title and body of the motion

and a motion acknowledging receipt of the report is passed by the council.

167 The report shall include, but not be limited to a comparison of the first six months

168 of the demand management pilot program at those transfer stations participating in the

169 pilot, including, but not limited to, the Factoria and Shoreline transfer stations, to the

170 same six months in 2016, for the following factors:

- 171 A. Transaction patterns;
- B. Wait times for customers to dispose of garbage;
- 173 C. Number of tons of waste and recycling received;
- 174 D. Revenues collected; and

175 E. Additional factors that the executive may consider relevant.

176 The report shall also include a discussion of the impact of the pilot program on

the rest of the county's solid waste system, lessons learned from the pilot program's

implementation and a recommendation on whether to proceed with the pilot program or

to terminate the pilot program.

180 The executive should file the report and the motion required by this proviso

181	within seven months of the first day of the implementation of the demand management
182	pilot program, in the form of a paper original and an electronic copy with the clerk of the
183	council, who shall retain the original and provide an electronic copy to all
184	councilmembers, the council chief of staff and the lead staff for the transportation,
185	economy and environment committee, or its successor.

P5 PROVIDED FURTHER THAT:

Of this appropriation, \$1,000,000 shall not be expended or encumbered until the executive transmits a report that evaluates a proposed garbage service change, whereby the frequency of garbage collection in the affected unincorporated area of the county would be reduced from every week to every other week and a motion that should acknowledge receipt of the report and reference the subject matter, the proviso's ordinance, ordinance section and proviso number in both the title and body of the motion and a motion acknowledging receipt of the report is passed by the council.

If the executive decides not to pursue the proposed garbage service change
described in this proviso, the report shall state this and no further reporting is required.
However, if in any update or new comprehensive solid waste management plan includes
the proposed garbage service change described in this proviso, then the report shall
include, but is not limited to:

A. A summary of the public outreach process, including the number of public meetings held in each council district, the dates and locations of the meetings and the approximate attendance. The public outreach process shall be complete by October 31, 2017, and at minimum consist of two public meetings in council district three, two public meetings in council district nine and one public meeting in each remaining council

204	district that contains unincorporated areas with customers who will be affected if the
205	proposed garbage service change is implemented. One of the public meetings in council
206	district nine shall be held in the Maple Hills community. The executive shall consult
207	with the county councilmembers representing the affected council districts on the
208	selection of the day of the week, time, and location for each public meeting, as well as the
209	text used in mailed notification of the public meetings. The executive shall provide
210	written notice of each public meeting via postal mail at least two weeks prior to the
211	meeting to customers who will be affected if the proposed garbage service change is
212	implemented;
213	B. Copies of all written materials and electronic materials, such as PowerPoint
214	presentations, used or disseminated at the public meetings;
215	C. A summary of the customer reaction to the proposed garbage service change
216	based on the public outreach process and from other forms of communication including
217	but not limited to emails, letters or calls to the executive reacting to the proposed garbage
218	service change;
219	D. The expected change in the recycling rate in unincorporated areas that the
220	executive is estimating will result from the proposed garbage service change, including
221	both a narrative description of and graphic or table representations of the estimates
222	measured against the most current relevant solid waste data;
223	E. The expected change in utilization of self-haul services at transfer stations that
224	the executive is estimating will result from the proposed garbage service change,
225	including both a narrative description of and graphic or table representations of the
226	estimates measured against the most current relevant solid waste data;

227	F. The expected change in the amount of organic materials collected that the
228	executive is estimating will result from the proposed garbage service change, including
229	both a narrative description of and graphic or table representations of the estimates
230	measured against the most current relevant solid waste data;
231	G. The expected change to the rates for customers in unincorporated areas that
232	the executive is estimating will result from the proposed garbage service change, as well
233	as the changes to revenues the executive estimates it will receive from the proposed
234	garbage service change; and
235	H. A plan to implement the proposed garbage service change that addresses the
236	concerns raised during the public outreach process.
237	The executive should file the report and the motion required by this proviso by
238	November 16, 2017, in the form of a paper original and an electronic copy with the clerk
239	of the council, who shall retain the original and provide an electronic copy to all
240	councilmembers, the council chief of staff and the lead staff for the committee of the
241	whole, or its successor.
242	P6 PROVIDED FURTHER THAT:
243	Of this appropriation, \$2,000,000 shall not be expended or encumbered until the
244	executive transmits a letter to the chair of the council from the facilities management
245	division stating that the solid waste division has declared the property located at 13620
246	SE Eastgate Way in Bellevue as surplus to its needs thereby beginning the surplus
247	property disposition process outlined in K.C.C. 4.56.070.
248	The executive should file the letter required by this proviso no later than three

248 The executive should file the letter required by this proviso no later than three

249 months after the Factoria transfer and recycling station capital project has reached final

250	completion, in the form of a paper original and an electronic copy with the clerk of the
251	council, who shall retain the original and provide an electronic copy to all
252	councilmembers, the council chief of staff and the lead staff for the committee of the
253	whole, or its successor.
254	SECTION 4. This ordinance takes effect only if, by October 31, 2017, the city of
255	Bellevue signs the Amended and Restated Interlocal Agreement as authorized by

256 Ordinance 17677 to extend the city of Bellevue's participation in the regional solid waste

system through 2040.
