### Description of request:

The third supplemental request for 2017-2018 includes various capital proposals in the Water and Land Resources Division. It includes, the 2018 CFT re-allocation as recommended by the Conservation Futures Citizens Committee for Fund 3151, the carbon sequestration program to implement two Memorandums of Understanding (MOU) with the Wastewater Treatment Division (WTD) and Solid Waste Division (SWD) in Fund 3292, a net-zero reallocation of spending authority between projects in Fund 3840, and increased authority Fund 3521 and Fund 3672.
